Light moderate winds have fallen in southern California, Nevada, Utah, southeastern Idaho, western Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma and in sections of the east coast. The temperature is much warmer in northern Alberta. The temperatures have fallen in northern Utah, southern Arizona, Tennessee and in the mountains of the west. Frost formed this morning in northern Illinois and in the Ohio valley.

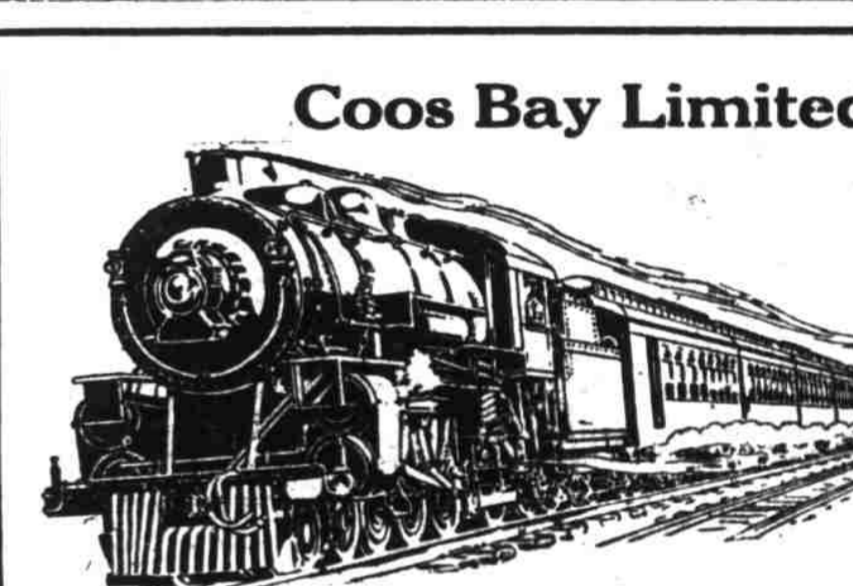
