

HUGHES' INCOME TAX STAND ON PARALLEL WITH 8-HOUR STAND

History Shows Verdict of Society Disregarded, Hughes and Corporations Opposing AGAINST EFFECTIVE LAWS

Opposed Tax Amendment as Impairment of State's Rights; Says Administration Too Restricted.

Washington, Oct. 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—In his speech at Binghamton and other places in New York, Charles E. Hughes is quoted as saying: "I favor the general principle of the eight hour day. I should like to see an eight hour work day."

In a message to the legislature of New York as governor of that state, January 5, 1910, opposing ratification of the income tax amendment, Mr. Hughes said: "I am in favor of conferring on the federal government the power to lay and collect such a tax. I believe that this power should be held by the federal government. But..."

He proceeded then to urge that to ratify the income tax as presented in the amendment "would be an impairment of the essential rights of the state," and he counseled the legislature not to do it.

Change in Attitude Singular.
There is a close parallel between the way in which Hughes "favored" the income tax and the way in which he now "favors" an eight hour day. In each case he was against measures that gave effect to the principle. History records that the verdict of society was in favor of the income tax. Disregarding Hughes and the corporations which were then fighting the adoption of the income tax amendment, the public approved it. It is somewhat singular, also, that Hughes was against the income tax amendment because of his regard for the rights of the state, while in the present campaign he is assailing the Democratic party because, he says, it is too much restricted by the doctrine of state's rights.

When the New York assembly voted on the ratification of the income tax on April 20, 1910, it was defeated by a majority of two votes. All the Democrats voted for it. Had Governor Hughes been in its favor, it would have been ratified. A motion to reconsider the vote by which it was lost was beaten by a majority of one vote.

Delayed Day of Income Tax.
Thus the day of the income tax was delayed by Hughes. New York failing to ratify, it required that much more time to take up the necessary number of states.
This is not the only instance, it is further pointed out, in which Hughes has in the past "favored" a principle, and stood in the way of putting the principle into effect. He also favored giving women the same pay for performing the same work as men, but he held off a bill to actually place women school teachers on the same footing with male teachers.
Hughes likewise favored lower rates on the railroads, then vetoed a bill reducing passenger fares.
From this record of Mr. Hughes on questions of social progress that he has favored, arises the question, "Does he also intend to veto all bills putting such things into effect?"

NAVAL BOARD COMES WEST IN FEW WEEKS TO LOOK OVER SITES

Washington, Oct. 13.—The five members of the commission on navy yards and naval stations are holding daily sessions and going through a vast amount of material bearing upon the various yards and stations of every character, preliminary to a trip to the seacoast to investigate and report upon the needs of the navy.

This commission is the one appointed by Secretary Daniels under authority of the last congress to look into the question of establishing a new navy yard or station on the Pacific coast, and to consider the question of submarine and torpedo boat bases on all the country's coast line. Probably it will be several weeks before the commission will arrive at Seattle to look over the navy yard at Bremerton, and at Portland and Astoria, where the question of a submarine base at the mouth of the Columbia will be considered.
It is stated that full opportunity will be given to representatives of each locality to present its case, and before long an itinerary will be announced, giving as much advance notice as possible. Emphasizing the point that this will be a business trip, the officers comprising the board announce that they must decline all forms of social entertainment.

They are under instructions to report at the beginning of the next session of congress or as soon thereafter as practicable, and the work will have to be hurried. At their offices in the navy building the members of the commission are now reading over reports made by former commissions that bear upon the subject, collecting data and charts on the various harbors, and arranging the material presented from all sources as to the advantages of the numerous candidates for navy yard and submarine base locations.
The commission will report as to whether a new navy yard should be placed on the Pacific, in preference to enlargement of existing yards, and this brings up the whole question of the suitability of existing plants, the strategic value of the yards, and their accessibility. Southern California is expected to make a strong plea for a new navy yard and for a submarine base.

Rear Admiral James M. Helm, recently in command of the reserve fleet, is the head of the board, with Chief Constructor Washington L. Capps, Civil Engineer Harry H. Rosseau, Captain George W. McEroy and Commander Charles L. Husey.

Dr. Brewer of Salem Dead, 69 Years Old
