Plans for the Missionary Educational Institute to be held for church and social workers of all denominations at the First Presbyterian church house, October 22 to 25, have been completed.

Matthews of Seattle, district superintendent of the Congregational Sunday School society, and chairman of the national territorial committee of the Missionary Educational movement, will preside at the rally and will introduce the institute faculty members who will lead the different mission study groups.

The purpose of the institute is to discover, develop and train missionary leaders for work in their own churches.
