

GENERAL JACKSON'S REMAINS WILL LIE IN STATE AT ARMORY

Hours Will Be From 10 A. M.
to 2 P. M. Tomorrow; Body
May Be Viewed.

FUNERAL AT 2 O'CLOCK

Escort From Vancouver, National
Guard, War Veterans and Civil
Officials Will Be in Cortege.

The body of General James Jackson, who died at his home, 330 North Thirty-second street, last Saturday, will lie in state at the Armory tomorrow from 10 a. m. to 2 p. m. All branches of the National Guard in the city will form at 2 p. m. and after funeral services conducted by Chaplain W. S. Gilbert of the Third regiment, O. G. will escort the body through the streets of the city. The Grand Army of the Republic will turn out in a body. The First regiment of the O. G. will also be present. The cortege will assemble in front of the Armory at 2 p. m. and will proceed to the cemetery. The pall bearers will be General C. F. Beebe, Major W. W. Wilson, Colonel C. L. Laughlin, Colonel C. H. Smith, Colonel C. A. Varnum, Governor to Attend.

Governor Withycombe, Mayor Albee, the city commissioners and officials of the Portland Chamber of Commerce will attend the services. An escort of honor will sound taps and fire a volley over his grave. This escort will probably consist of a detail from the U. S. regular army at Vancouver. Mayor Albee has requested that all flags in the city be placed at half mast in honor of the distinguished soldier.

General Jackson was identified with the Oregon National Guard for 24 years, first as an inspector-instructor under detail from the United States army, and afterward as inspector-general of the Oregon National Guard. He was retired in 1898 from the United States army only to render most valuable services to the state when the call came for him to go to the Philippines. He served in the regular army from the outbreak of the Civil war.

General Jackson is survived by his wife and by his daughter, Miss Marion Jackson.

WOMAN IS BRUISED IN ACCIDENTAL FALL OFF A MOUNTAIN TRAIL

Clara Gross Sustains Painful but Not Serious Injuries Near Columbia Highway.

Clara Gross, 17-year-old daughter of Mrs. William Gross of 1249 East Salmon street, suffered a distressing experience on the Wahkeena Falls trail yesterday as a result of having friends start up the Wahkeena Falls trail in the afternoon, planning to return to the highway by way of the Multnomah Falls trail. Although advised not to do so, Miss Gross walked ahead of the rest of the party until she got beyond halting distance. At a slightly point in the eastern end of Benson park she leaned over the edge of the trail to look below, relying upon a small tree or clump of brush for support. Losing her hold she rolled considerable distance down the rugged incline, her descent ending in a clump of bushes, the impact of which rendered her unconscious. In the meantime her companions had passed the place whence she fell and her absence was not noted until they had arrived at Multnomah Falls, when a searching party was sent back over the trail.

Upon recovering consciousness the girl, whose arms and legs were badly bruised by her fall and her clothing torn, crawled back to the trail and started back towards Wahkeena Falls. Darkness overtook her and when she arrived at the highway she was exhausted.

Hurried to the city in an automobile Miss Gross was attended by a physician who found her to be suffering more from the fright of her experience than from any serious injury.

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
