Great Firstsacker of Cincinnati Reds Ended Season of 1916 With .339 Average.

9 PLAYERS IN .300 CLASS

Lon McCarly, who was with Brooklyn Dodgers Short Time, Equals Chase's Batting Mark.

Grabbing 184 base swats in 413 contests, Hal Chase, the great first baseman of the Cincinnati Reds, topped the National League regulars during the 1916 season with the percentage of .339, according to the official averages.

On the other hand, the Pirates fell one point shy of Daubert's mark. Roger Hornsby, the Cardinal wonder, topped the horsehide at a .337 average.

The "shrinking violet," Benny Kauff, who last January threatened to show Ty Cobb up, hit for a modest .264. Inasmuch as Carson Hightower, who went from the Boston to Pittsburgh last fall, is of much interest to Portland and Oregon baseball fans, his record for the season is checked out of the records.
