STEAMER CREW AND PASSENGERS RESCUED. (Continued From Page One.) talking to the bridge and waiting for aid that lifeboat crews could not give them in the face of the mountainous seas. Livesavers from the Deal, Walmer and Kingstown stations, fought all through the night, but it was not until most of today to bridge the gap of swirling waters and take the men and women off the ship. Two or three times the lifeboats were narrowly escaping drowning. The American vessel was only one of half a dozen that were in dire straits for a time, as a result of a tremendous blow that swept up the channel and the Dover straits Sunday night, continuing with great force through the night. The Sibiria was the only vessel of size to bedrive on the treacherous sands. She stuck fast, and the combers rolled over her, broke her, and she was found by the breakers, the big vessel sank lower and lower into the sea, until today her bridge, on which the two shore passengers and crew had clustered, was only a little above the level of the highest wave. The Sibiria, of 3225 tons, formerly the Hertha of the Hamburg-American line and now owned by the Stensborg Coal company, left Sydney, November 7 for Cherbourg, carrying grain and a number of men and women passengers, all said to be Americans.
