

BASEBALL BAT BEST FOR WIFE DESERTER, SAYS JUDGE M'GINN

"Remand Him to Jail, He Can Make No Statement Here," Declares the Court.

SCATHING REBUKE GIVEN

Edward Hanson, Accused of Leaving Family; Release on Habeas Corpus Proceedings Is Denied Today.

Edward Hanson, who deserted a wife and six children, was today sentenced by Judge McGinn to "lie in jail until he rots, unless he pays his wife a reasonable sum for her support."

"There are some people you can govern by kindness," said Judge McGinn, whose righteous indignation reached the boiling point when Attorney Seneca Fouts sought to force Hanson's release from jail on habeas corpus proceedings. "Hanson is not one of them. The way to govern him is with a baseball bat, and that is the way I am going to govern him."

"Remand him to jail. He can make no statement here, I would not believe any statement he would make. Uttermost is issued."

"Let me see. I will be in office until the first of January. He will stay in jail until then, and if my successor will take my advice, he will lie in jail until he rots, or he will pay his wife and children the money I ordered him to pay them."

Fouts sought to get in a word, contending that the court was not fully informed, and that Hanson was willing to pay something to his wife.

"Has he paid her one cent?" demanded Judge McGinn.

Fouts admitted he had not.

"I know all about this case," continued the judge. "The first time he was brought in here he was insolent, and the next time he was brought in here he was contemptuous, even beyond my power to endure. A baseball bat is the thing he needs used on him."

"A man who is responsible for bringing his children into the world is in big business when he refuses to support them. Why doesn't he live at home with them, instead of living with other women?"

"It isn't everybody who can do that," insisted Fouts. "I've tried it a couple of times myself and failed. You won't give him a chance to say anything."

"I have heard what his wife has had to say," replied the judge.

"If you would go and talk to two of mine," said Fouts, "I suppose they would say the same things about me."

"And they might not be far wrong, either," declared McGinn.

"Remand him to jail," continued the judge. "Go to the supreme court if you want to get him out of jail."

"That's where I will go," hotly replied Fouts.

Judge McGinn called attention to the fact that he had received a letter from Mrs. Rose Hanson, 222 Jefferson street, pleading for Hanson.

FURNITURE DEALER IS SUED

William Gadsby Accused of Extorting Sum of \$3346.45.

William Gadsby, furniture dealer, is the defendant in a suit for \$3346.45 brought by Jennie Cordano, 98 West Park street, who alleges that Gadsby extorted that sum from her under threat of sending her nephew, John Cordano, to the state penitentiary on a criminal charge.

John Cordano, with G. H. Bowman and Fred Thiele, were employees at the Gadsby & Son furniture store, First and Washington streets. They were caught taking goods from the store, as admitted by Frank Collier, attorney for Mrs. Cordano.

Mr. Gadsby said the furniture taken amounted in value to \$3000, and the expense of finding out who was taking it ran up to \$44.45. He denied that Mrs. Cordano had been intimidated or coerced, but said that she paid for the furniture taken by all three.

In her complaint Mrs. Cordano alleges that she was intimidated, coerced and subjected to harsh language by the defendant and the Pinkerton Detective Agency. She says she was told her nephew would be sent to the penitentiary and she would be disgraced if she did not pay the money demanded.

She alleges that Bowman gave Gadsby a note for \$500 and Thiele gave a note for \$500, and the defendant demanded that she take the two notes and pay him the full amount in cash.

Abuse of discretion on the part of the court and improper conduct on the part of Deputy District Attorney Collier are charged in a motion for a new trial filed by Attorney Ralph R. Dunaway in the case of Crayton R. Andrews, who was convicted of larceny by bailer and was sentenced by Circuit Judge Davis to serve one to ten years in the penitentiary.

Collier made derogatory remarks about him and his attorney before the jury, and that when his attorney interposed objections during the trial Judge Davis characterized these objections as "tommyrot." He says the court's conduct was not judicial.

Andrews was convicted of cashing a \$1700 draft entrusted to him for delivery to another person in connection with a realty deal.

WOMAN AWARDED DAMAGES

Miss Esther Lindberg Wins \$500 for Injuries in Auto Accident.

A verdict for \$500 was awarded Miss Esther Lindberg in her suit against W. K. Botsford and Arthur Serr for \$15,000 damages for personal injuries she received when she was thrown from Botsford's automobile the night of May 11 last.

She and Mabel Morley, her chum, had gone with the young men in Botsford's racing car, and while speeding on the Base Line road Miss Lindberg and Botsford were spilled out as their car swerved past another machine, Miss Lindberg was in the hospital six weeks. Mr. Botsford paid her hospital and doctor bills.

Botsford, on the witness stand yesterday afternoon, disclaimed responsibility for the accident. He said he did not invite the girls to go riding, that he had never met them before that night, that the girls were invited by Serr, who was at the wheel throughout the ride. He denied that they traveled at excessive speed, and said Miss Lindberg never protested against the speed they were going.

Serr, who was formerly connected with an automobile agency in Portland, is now in California and was not at the trial.

ADMIT LARCENY OF AUTO.

Lloyd Welfare and Alexander Griggs, the two men who hired Donald Morris to take them in an automobile to St. Helens on the night of October 26 and held him up and robbed him of his machine, today entered pleas of guilty to the charge of larceny of an automobile. The testimony was in support of the charges of Mrs. Nannie Mathews of Pendleton, daughter of the late Anna E. Dale, that her own daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. David S. Tobias of Seattle, had, by improper influence, induced Mrs. Dale to leave the bulk of her \$30,000 estate to the Tobiases.

Mrs. Crane testified that many years next door neighbor to Mrs. Dale and used to run into the Dale home 10 or 15 times a day. She now lives in San Francisco with her daughter, who is the wife of an army officer, and while in Portland on a visit happened to hear of the will contest and voluntarily offered her testimony.

Recalling Christmas morning of 1912, she said soon after she saw the Tobiases leave the Dale home she heard Grandma Dale moaning and ran in to see what was the matter. She found the old lady only partly dressed, with no fire in the house, and moaning as though in much distress.

"They didn't come the time," the witness testified Grandma Dale moaned.

When she was able to talk, the witness said Mrs. Dale told her that Tobias had given her a glass of some dark liquid to drink, saying it was Christmas cheer, and when she began to feel unwell, Tobias said to induce her to sign a will he had prepared.

"I refused to sign it," she said, "I was too smart for them." Dale told me, testified Mrs. Crane. "I may die at any time," she said, "and I want you to know where my will is. It is under the mattress in my room, and if you morning you do not see my bedroom curtain go up, you will know I am dead, and I want you to come in and get the will."

The witness said when Mr. and Mrs. Tobias returned that morning she spoke about Mrs. Dale's condition to "Oh, she's drunk," Mrs. Tobias told me," said the witness.

Mrs. Crane said that in the spring of 1913 she saw the Tobiases take Grandma Dale to the hospital. As they left the old home, Mrs. Dale held back and cried and did not want to go, the witness said.

New Will Mentioned.

"She returned in about a year," said the witness, "and she told me she was glad to get back home."

"She said David and Mattie (Mr. and Mrs. Tobias) had dinged her to make a new will giving her property to David. She told me she did not do it."

The Tobiases owned an automobile and lived beyond their means, the witness said. Mrs. Dale often told her, adding that she did not want to leave her estate to them for fear they would soon squander it.

Mrs. Mathews was called to the stand shortly before noon and testified that before her father died it was understood in the family that the property was to be left to her and she was to give the property to her daughter, Mrs. Tobias.

Chairman of Bar Association Legislative Committee Reports, Own Responsibility.

THREE SUGGESTIONS MADE

Legislative enactment as prerequisite and abolition of petition circuit courts is also advocated.

In a report read at the opening session of the annual meeting of the Oregon State Bar association in the United States bar court room this morning, Poece C. Nelson, of the firm of Beach, Simon & Nelson, chairman of the committee on legislation, suggested for the consideration of his fellow members of the bar that the Oregon system contained defects which should be abolished.

It was a one man report, signed only by the chairman of the committee, Mr. Nelson saying that he did not wish "to incriminate others."

The changes he proposes are three:

1. Making the presentation of a measure to the legislature for enactment or rejection, a prerequisite to the right to submit it to a vote of the people.
2. Abolishing the circulation of petitions and requiring a certain percentage of registered voters to sign in person at the offices of the respective county clerks or at other designated places, petitions for initiative legislation.
3. Requiring an affirmative vote of two-thirds of those participating in an election to amend the constitution.

"It is not the time at hand," asked Mr. Nelson, "for the bar of Oregon to argue that the people be given opportunity to say whether or not certain changes would be beneficial?"

"Surely the people can be trusted not to place a limitation upon their powers unless the ultimate weal of all will be conserved thereby."
