

JURY IS SECURED TO TRY BARTHOLOMEW IN 'GREEN TRUNK' CASE

Prisoner's Attorney Confident State Cannot Prove Guilt; Will Not Plead Insanity.

LUND IS NOT IN COURT

Los Angeles Man Who Came Here and Demonstrated His Innocence Not Present in Court Today.

Unusual speed in the selection of the jury to try George Bartholomew, accused in connection with the slaying of John Lund, featured the preliminary trial in the "green trunk murder" case before Circuit Judge Davis this morning. The entire 12 men were secured just before noon today.

Bartholomew, seated beside his attorney, John White, appeared in court today. The legal defense is a young man, the son of ex-Judge Samuel White. The legal defense was appointed by the court. Representing the state is Chief Deputy District Attorney John Collier and Deputy Charles Robinson.

The court room was comfortably filled by spectators and interest in the court proceedings is keen.

Will Try Case on Merits. According to Attorney White, the defense will not put up an insanity defense. "We are confident that the state will not be able to prove that my client is in any way responsible for the crime," he said. "The case will be tried on its merits, so far as we are concerned."

Questions asked the prospective jurors followed the usual procedure, the state, however, putting particular stress on the availability of the evidence submitted is largely circumstantial. Each juror was asked if he had read or heard of the case and whether or not he had formed any opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the defendant.

Several Women on Stand. Among the spectators are several women. Inquiry this morning failed to disclose that Oscar Lund, who came from Los Angeles to clear his name in connection with the case, was in court today. One Lund had been named by Bartholomew as the person who had actually struck the blow that caused the death of Lund in the Stark street lodging house.

The suspect convinced the authorities, however, that he was not the man wanted; in fact, Bartholomew declared that the Los Angeles man was not the person to whom he had referred in his statements to the police.
