Citation to the school fund loans is made because the organizations which initiated the rural credits amendment and the state board have agreed on the terms of a rural credits bill which

the school fund is now loaned. State Treasurer Kay has replied to Senator Shanks by declaring it is not the policy of the state board to collect interest on the school fund loans more often than once a year, although the law says the interest shall be due semi-annually. Mr. Kay says it would work hardship on farmers to collect interest semi-annually.

Delinquent Interest Is Small. Out of 5000 school fund notes only \$20 have delinquent interest, says Mr. Kay who declares this a better show

A review of the report of the state treasurer for the biennial period ending September 30, 1916, shows that interest had not been paid on \$8100 of the fund for more than four years; that interest had not been paid on \$39,900 for a period of more than three years; on \$132,511.17 for a period of more than wo years; on the sum of \$514,713.81 for a period of more than one year and on the enormous sum of \$2,870,618.29 interest was delinquent all the way from one day to six months. 
