

ECONOMIC JUSTICE MUST PREVAIL TO PROMOTE WELL BEING

The Oregon Peace Society,
Just Organized, Advances
Theory Against Fighting.

WAR IS WRONG METHOD
The Society Goes on Record as Em-
phatically Opposed to Compulsory
Military Training and Service.

Declaring that war is the wrong
method for the settlement of interna-
tional disputes and that justice can-
not exist between nations until econ-
omic justice prevails between the in-
dividuals within those nations, the
Oregon Peace Society was organized at
a meeting at the Central library Tues-
day evening for the purpose of the
promotion of peace.


Against Compulsory Training.
The society goes on record as op-
posed to compulsory military training
and service and in its subsequent meet-
ings and in the literature it will dis-
tribute this stand will be emphasized.
Dr. Joseph K. Hart of Reed college is
the president of the society, H. M.
Esterly is vice president and Miss J.
L. Trevett is secretary and treasurer.
Dr. Hart will address a mass meeting
called by the peace society for Tues-
day evening, January 23, at 8 o'clock
library hall on the subject of anti-
militarism.

Article I—(Preamble).
Know all men that whereas, war as
a method of determining disputes be-
tween civilized states is wrong and
does not provide a just solution of the
problems or any problem which may
arise from time to time by reason of
international friction; and
Whereas, there has been created a
demand for compulsory military service
and training in the United States which
is opposed to American ideals of citi-
zenship and constitutes a menace to
social, industrial and political lib-
erty; and
Whereas, justice between nations
cannot exist until economic justice ex-
ists between individuals within such
nations.

Article II—(Objects and Purposes).
Now therefore, we, the undersigned,
hereby associate ourselves together for
the following purposes, namely:
To advance the cause of peace among
nations, to hasten the abolition of in-
ternational war and to encourage and
promote a peaceful settlement of in-
ternational differences, and in particu-
lar,
(a) To promote a thorough and
scientific investigation and study of
the causes of war and of the practi-
cal methods to prevent and avoid it.
(b) To aid in the development of in-
ternational law and to increase the
agreement on the rules thereof and the
acceptance of the same among nations.
(c) To diffuse information and to
educate public opinion regarding the
causes, nature and effect of war and
means for its prevention and avoidance.
To Define International Rights.
(d) To establish a better under-
standing of international rights and
duties and a more perfect sense of in-
ternational justice among the inhabi-
tants of civilized and other countries.
(e) To cultivate feelings of mutual
friendliness between the inhabitants of
different countries and to increase the
knowledge and understanding of each
other by the several nations and
peoples.

(f) To promote a general acceptance
of peaceable methods for the settle-
ment of international disputes.
(g) To maintain, promote and assist
such establishments, organizations, as-
sociations and agencies as shall be
deemed necessary or useful in the ac-
complishment of the purposes of the
society.
Economic Justice Included.
(h) To promote economic justice be-
tween all individuals within the bound-
aries of all nations and to encourage
such measures as tend to promote
economic justice throughout the world.
(i) To prevent the adoption of meas-
ures that would force upon the coun-
try a system of universal, compul-
sory military service or training.
(j) To prevent the compulsory mili-
tary service or training of minors in
or out of school.
(k) To secure the repeal of the
"draft" clause in the army reorganiza-
tion bill.
(l) To establish federal jurisdiction
over issues which concern unnatur-
alized residents in the various states.
Regarding Foreign Investments.
(m) To secure the formulation of the
principle that foreign investments shall
be made at the risk of the investor,
without claim to the military and naval
protection of the United States govern-
ment.
(n) To secure action under the
"Hensley" clause of the naval appropria-
tions act or with any act of con-
gress looking toward the establish-
ment of an international court of ar-
bitration.
(o) To secure such dealing with
neighboring republics that our relation-
ships with them shall be free from
the evils of secret diplomacy, and that
in arriving at decisions affecting their
well being, counsel be taken with the
governments of other American states
and with those groups in our own
population most sympathetic and most
likely to be intelligent as to the inter-
ests of the people of those republics,
to oppose the practice of secret
diplomacy.
(p) To secure publicity and demo-
cratic control of all foreign relations
and especially the declaration of war.
To do any and all things necessary and
proper to carry out the objects and
purposes of the society.
