

ALLIES MAY ATTACK GERMANY BY WAY OF NEUTRAL LANDS, FEAR

Teutonic Military Experts, in
Considering Spring Drive,
Say Three Ways Possible.

GERMANS PLOT MOVES

Theorists of Central Empires Profess
to Believe Schemes Against Neu-
tral Nations Contemplated.

Berlin, Jan. 22.—(I. N. S.)—With the threatened spring offensive of the entente allies, a matter soon to be reckoned with, the eyes of Germany are turned towards Holland, Switzerland and Denmark, for it is through one of those countries that an attack is expected by military experts.

The extreme nature of the allied demands in their reply to President Wilson's peace note is regarded in Berlin as indicating a feeling of desperation which might manifest itself in acts that might draw other nations into the war.

Advantages Are Cited.
From a theoretical standpoint it might be advantageous for the entente forces to land in Holland and strike either into the industrial section of the upper Rhine or into Belgium, rolling up the German front.

Another course open to them is through Switzerland from the French side into southern Alsace, which might result in a rolling up of the German lines in this position and clearing much of the provinces of Alsace and Lorraine.

Still another possibility is that the allies will strike through Denmark for a march into central Germany, although this course would require a vast force to carry through successfully.

East Front Not Feared.
News from the east front does not indicate a likelihood of a resumption of great activity. The Russian railroads are being repaired through overuse, which might also explain the Russian failures in Roumania.

It is considered likely that a part of General Sarraill's force will be withdrawn for a landing in Syria. This move might enable the entente to cut the Turkish railways and make the Mesopotamia campaign reasonably simple.

Russian Official Statement.
Petrograd, Jan. 22.—(I. N. S.)—Sunday's official statement.

"Western front: In the direction of Kovell, in the region west and north-west of Velick, we made two artillery attacks on some sectors of the enemy's positions. At various points the enemy's wire entanglements were damaged and many successful hits were observed. The enemy bombarded with heavy artillery our position north of Bechoyev, on the Naryvka river, and slightly damaged our trenches in the region of the village of St. Komorokhe. South of Stanislaw our scouts attacked a reconnoitering party in the region of the village of Dagivord and after a hand to hand struggle a number of Austrians were bayoneted and others made prisoners.

"Roumanian front: No events of importance occurred. At some points successful reconnoitering operations by our scouts and Roumanian scouts took place."

French Official Statement.
Paris, Jan. 22.—(I. N. S.)—Sunday's official statement says:

"In the region of Lassigny, a German attack upon one of our trenches in the direction of Canny-sur-Matz (Oise) region was easily repulsed. The enemy left prisoners in our hands. On the right bank of the Meuse there was intermittent activity by the artillery on both sides, with engagements in Caubieres wood. The night was calm on the remainder of the front."

Czar Issues Special Orders.
Petrograd, Jan. 22.—(I. N. S.)—Czar Nicholas issued special orders to the cabinet last night to begin working immediately toward a supreme effort to end the war in victory for Russia and her allies.

"There must be no thought of peace until final victory is obtained," said the czar, in a note to the premier.

The document declares all Russia must unite in gathering supplies for the army.

San Francisco, Jan. 22.—(P. N. S.)—"She" that passed in the night would be a fitting title for the experiences of Mrs. J. Rout and her pretty daughter, who are at the Manx hotel.

Mrs. Rout, wife of a British sea captain, and her daughter were residing in Liverpool, England, when word reached them that the captain had been seriously ill in a Chilean port, and that he was shipping to Honolulu.

So mother and daughter decided to join the patient. On their way to Honolulu they got as far as San Francisco, but yesterday came a cable from Captain Rout, advising his wife and daughter that he had arrived in England. Now both women have to retrace their steps to the United Kingdom.

North Powder, Or., Jan. 22.—Under the name of the Junior Citizens' league, the boys and younger men of North Powder have formed a club to encourage self-government, clean athletics and fair play in all the activities of boy life. The club has the active support of city officials and all local people interested in the welfare of boys.

The city council voted unanimously to grant the boys the use of a room in the city hall until permanent quarters can be secured, and regular business meeting is held there Monday evening of each week.

Ambitious plans are laid for a swimming pool, a boys' library, gymnastic apparatus, and the club hopes eventually to own its own clubhouse and grounds. A baseball nine is planned for, also a junior orchestra and glee club.
