

ABOLITION OF STATE GAME COMMISSION IS FAVORED AT ALBANY

Commercial Club Wants Linn
County Delegation to Work
to This End at Salem;

COUNTY CONTROL ASKED

Present System of Administering Game
Laws Considered Expensive in
View of Alleged Incompetency.

Albany, Or., Jan. 23.—At the instigation of a large number of Linn county sportsmen, Manager Charles P. Ohling of the Albany Commercial club, has addressed letters to the Linn county delegation in the legislature asking it to work for abolishment of the state game commission.

There has been collected in Linn county in the past two years \$5911 in hunting licenses and it is urged that all the protection that has been received in that time is something like \$200 which Deputy Game Warden J. R. Metzger of this city received for his services. He has received nothing for last year's work and is not sure that he will draw any more compensation.

County Enforcement Asked.
The communication asks the legislature to abolish the game officer and turn the game laws over to the counties to enforce, allowing them to keep the license money, and make the county game wardens directly responsible to the county courts.

It is charged that deer are being run in the mountains and that there are no wardens to protect them. A few years ago this practice was broken up through the efforts of a few men. It is also stated that members of the Portland and Brownsville rod and gun clubs carry cards which instruct all wardens arresting the holder to communicate with the state game warden before commencing action. F. M. Brown, deputy state game warden, resides in Brownsville.

More Draconic Laws Favored.
The local sportsmen favor more draconic game laws. They would have the pheasant season shortened and reduce the bag limit. They would have ducks better protected, for some species have disappeared and others are rapidly diminishing.

The communication also asks for an investigation of the office of state biologist, which State Game Warden W. L. Finley created. Complaint is made that the game commission occupies expensive office rooms on the ground floor of the Oregon building in Portland and that State Biologist Finley travels over the state and to other states giving lectures, and that he spent a large sum of money in employing 40 eastern Oregon cowboys to rope a mountain lion so that he could get a picture of it.

Local sportsmen charge the state game office with opening the pheasant season last year only long enough to collect license fees.

Mrs. Adel Doughton Passes.
Albany, Or., Jan. 23.—Mrs. Adele Doughton, wife of F. S. Doughton, died at her home here Monday, aged 75 years. She was born on Petty Plantation, N. C., March 1, 1841, the daughter of Colonel B. F. Petty, a prominent Carolina planter.

She came to Oregon with her family in 1884 and settled on a farm near Albany, living in this vicinity ever since. She is survived by her husband, one brother, M. J. Petty of Los Angeles; eight children, 21 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. The children are Mrs. R. K. Ohling and L. M. Doughton of Albany, Mrs. Cynthia Wallace and Mrs. Ada Van den Norte of Santa Rosa, Cal.; D. B. and John Doughton of Lebanon, Or.; F. Doughton of Melrose, New Mexico, and Mrs. Cora Simon of Seaside, Or.

The funeral will be held Tuesday at 1 o'clock at Bethel chapel, near Lebanon, and the burial will be in the Lebanon cemetery.
