A large low pressure area is approaching the northern California coast. It has caused general rain in that state and rain or snow over a large portion of the north Pacific states. A high pressure area of considerable strength covers the entire slope of the Rocky mountains, and a small depression is centered over Minnesota. The barometer is relatively high over the lower Lake region, snow has fallen in the northern states between the Rocky mountains and the Mississippi river. Rain has fallen locally in Louisiana, Florida and the District of Columbia. The temperatures have risen in the upper Mississippi valley and fallen in the north Atlantic states.

FUNERAL OF FUNSTON IS SET FOR SATURDAY AND TO BE MILITARY

Body of General Will Lie in State in City Hall of San Francisco After Its Arrival.

MAJOR BELL IS IN CHARGE

All of the Regular Troops Stationed Around San Francisco May Will Participate in the Procession.

San Francisco, Feb. 21.—(P. N. S.)—The body of the late Major General Frederick Funston will reach San Francisco at 3:30 o'clock Friday afternoon. It will lie in state at the city hall until shortly after noon Saturday, when the funeral will be held in the First Presbyterian church, where the Funston family worshipped. Rev. William Kirk Guthrie will preach the funeral sermon.

Major General J. Franklin Bell, in person will command the funeral escort accompanied by his staff, all mounted. Every other military honor will be paid to the body of the distinguished soldier.

Those in general were the arrangements announced late today at army headquarters. Some details were still to be completed.

Charles S. Fee, general passenger and traffic manager of the Southern Pacific company received a telegram last night from the San Antonio office that the body of the late Major General Funston is on its way to San Francisco as the first section of train No. 9, accompanied by Captain Fitzhugh Lee, the late general's aide-de-camp, and an escort of eight soldiers.

The body will be met at Third and Townsend streets by a battalion of regular coast artillery men. It will be carried on a caisson of Battery B, First California field artillery of Oakland, to the city hall, and lie in state there with a guard of honor until the hour of the funeral.

Major Ralph Makes Request. This was granted at the request of Major Ralph and the public will be allowed to view the body throughout the night.

All of the regular troops stationed around the city and every officer will be in the funeral procession that will escort the body to the church and later to the Presidio.

Invitations have been sent also to the National Guard, the United States War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Loyal Legion and other military organizations to accompany the body on the last march.

At the door of the church the body will be removed from the caisson by eight pallbearers, non-commissioned officers, and they will carry it into the edifice, followed by the pallbearers, who will be officers of high rank.

Military Parade to Cemetery. There will be nothing military about the services in the church. The professional march to the national cemetery will be purely military, however.

GENERAL FUNSTON'S SUCCESSOR IS ANNOUNCED

El Paso, Texas, Feb. 21.—(U. P.)—Major General Pershing was notified today by Secretary of War Baker of his appointment as commander of the southern department, succeeding General Funston. He will leave for headquarters at San Antonio sometime this week.

As soon as the cortege enters the Presidio gate at Lombard street artillery at the forts will begin to boom in salute, which will continue until the last salute of 13 guns is fired.

After a brief service at the graveside there will be three volleys of musketry, taps will sound and the artillery will roar the major-general's salute of 13 guns.

The body of General Funston will occupy a grave in the national cemetery beside that of his son, Arthur McArthur Funston, who died several years ago. Young Funston was named after Major-General Arthur McArthur, U. S. army, deceased.

Soldiers Salute Train. Marfa, Texas, Feb. 21.—(L. N. S.)—The train bearing the body of Major General Frederick Funston to San Francisco for burial passed through here today. It will arrive at El Paso late today. The caisson is in a special observation car on the rear of the train and two privates constantly stand at attention beside it. They are relieved every two hours.

The route of the train follows the international border for 1000 miles and all along the way, singly and in groups, soldiers came to attention and saluted as it passed.

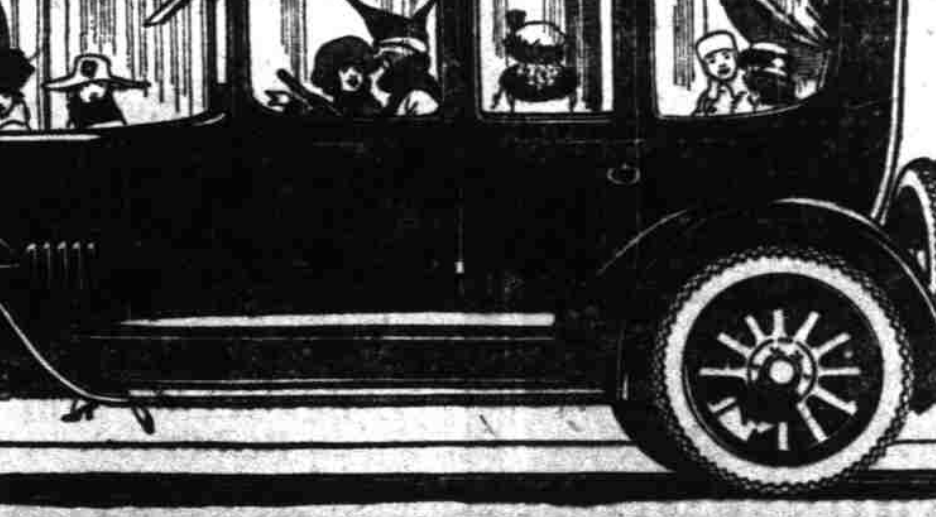
