

### TAHOMA HITS ROCK IN UPPER COLUMBIA; STERN IS DAMAGED

River Boat Runs Into Submerged Obstruction Above Carson, Wash.

### OFFICERS AND CREW SAFE

Damage Sustained Is Reported Slight; Plans Already Made to Remove Craft From the Rocks.

Striking a submerged rock one mile above Carson, Wash., in the upper Columbia river, the stern-wheel passenger and freight steamer Tahoma was partially sunk at 11:30 o'clock last night. The captain and crew remained aboard the boat. The bow of the craft remained out of water, the stern being partially submerged. Water entered the engine room, but the fires were not put out. The accident occurred when the boat was making her regular run from Hood River to Portland.

Reports from the local offices of the People's Navigation Company at the foot of Pine street, owners of the boat, said today that the craft was not seriously damaged and that efforts to rescue her would be made as soon as possible.

Information stated that the mishap took place at Dalles City rock. Captain C. Nelson was in charge of the steamer. Captain Nelson arrived on this morning at the Dalles. Saunders, agent for the line, is making arrangements to float the Tahoma.

### CARRANZA TO RETURN PROPERTY SEIZED IN REVOLUTIONARY DAYS
