BEAVERS' DEFENSE IS STRONGER THIS YEAR SAYS MANAGER MAC

Indications Are That Portland Will Be as Strong Defensively as in 1910.

INFIELD APPEARS STRONG

Pitching Staff Will Outshine Last Season's Crop as Fielders—Outfielders Make Classy Fly Chasers.

Portland Baseball Training Camp, Marysville, Cal., March 24.—Manager Walter McCredie believes he has a better fielding team than he had last year, just as he thinks he has a much better hitting team.

Of course, the inner works are most important from the standpoint of defense, and in Hollocher and Siglin Mac has satisfied himself that he has added a great deal of fielding strength over Joe Evans and Chuck Ward, for the reason that the two newcomers have reputations for steadiness and their records bear out this reputation. Ward and Evans were liable at any time to boot one in a pinch, which lost a lot of ball games for Portland. Hollocher and Siglin, from the latter's bureau of publicity, may boot one once in a while, but they will not do it persistently in the pinch.

Newcomers Great Fielders.

Hollocher had a record around .960 last year, which is going some. He is a shortstop, while Siglin was some 10 points higher, a grand record for a second baseman, who may not have to cover the ground of a shortstop but who must make a greater variety of plays.

Outfielders Are Good.

In the outfield McCredie will have four much stronger fielders in Williams, Farmer, Willie and Southworth than he had in Willie, Southworth, Speas and Nixon. Farmer is said to be a great left fielder and that will be welcome to McCredie, as it will enable him to shift his outfield to the right in an emergency. Considerably more may be expected of the outfielding this summer than last, as the men seem naturally fitted for their positions. However, one drawback to the outfield is that Williams, Willie and Southworth are left-handed batters, while Farmer swings from the right side of the plate.

Fisher in Good Shape.

Gus Fisher ought to have a better year than last, judging from the way he feels. Fisher is very careful of his condition and to be sure he will give no chance for old Kid Rheumatism to butt in, refused to go bathing at Waikiki until the last day but one of the Beavers' stay in Honolulu. Fisher ought, then, to have a better fielding average than he had last year, considering that his arm will be in better shape. Marshall and O'Brien are in good shape and capable of improvement. O'Brien's improvement has been manifest.

The Pitchers, Judging from their work at Honolulu, appear to be better fielders than last year, although there will hardly be any Gene Krapp among them. With Gene Krapp in the box, McCredie always figured that he had five infielders, instead of four. He has been drilling his pitchers on the handling of bunts and says they have had a great deal of natural practice in the games here in view of the fact that the colored troopers and the Chinese pitchers are concerned. Fenner, Helfrich and Zweifel appear to be high class batters on the part of the local teams. McCredie has looked on it with the eye of approval so far as his pitchers are concerned.

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
