

## PLANTS ON COOS BAY TO CONSTRUCT DOZEN GOVERNMENT VESSELS

Theodore Brent of Federal Shipping Board Is Pleased With Facilities for Work.

Marshfield, Or., April 12.—Theodore Brent of the federal shipping commission left Thursday for San Francisco, after a conference with Coos bay shipbuilders and lumbermen. No definite contract will be let until next week, but it was the understanding that Coos bay is to build 12 of the vessels for the government, and possibly more.

If the contract, as planned, is closed, the C. A. Smith company will put in a shipyard and build four vessels, and Kruse & Banks, now operating a yard at North Bend, will build eight. If these can be turned out at the rate of one a month, Coos bay will be awarded the contract for 12 more of the vessels. Arno Meren of the C. A. Smith company states that the Coos bay mills can furnish ship timbers enough to turn out two vessels a month.

Mr. Brent was high in his praise of the new steam schooner Johanna Smith, just launched for the C. A. Smith company. He said it was the best vessel of the kind he has seen, the watertight compartments being especially valuable in withstanding torpedo attacks.

### Marconi Plant Being Dismantled.

Marshfield, Or., April 12.—Operator G. A. Williamson of the local Marconi wireless station, recently taken over by the navy with other similar stations, is dismantling the plant on orders of the navy department. A naval officer will be here in a few days to check up on the work. The local station has been depended upon by merchant vessels making this port.

### Big Factory Changes Hands.

Marshfield, Or., April 12.—Word was received from San Francisco Thursday stating that the deal had been closed whereby Clark & Callaghan of that city will take over and operate the box factory in North Bend. The plant will employ about 100 men and boys.

### Indict Indian Plotters.

New York, April 12.—(U. P.)—Indictments charging conspiracy to foment insurrections in India were returned by a federal grand jury Thursday against Dr. Ernest Sekunna and Wolf von Igel, Germans, and Chandra Chakrabarty, and Heramba L. Gupta, Hindus. The technical charge against the men is that of setting on foot a military expedition against a friendly nation.

### Shoot Employer's Wife.

San Francisco, April 12.—(U. P.)—Mrs. C. Harry Forsland, 2323 Dolores street, was shot down and seriously wounded Thursday by Mrs. Nellis Merriman, stenographer for Mrs. Forsland's husband, a manufacturer of paints.

### Rests to Teach Driving.

Chicago, April 12.—(I. N. S.)—Rario Rest, king of America's speedways, will be chief instructor of school for army drivers which will be established here under the auspices of the Chicago Speedway association. Fast driving and shooting from the "hip" while speeding will be included in the curriculum.

## Plasterer Falls From Auditorium

Slipping, while walking a scaffold, 25 feet high inside the new Auditorium at Third and Market streets, Daniel McCall, a plasterer, fell to the floor and suffered a serious fracture of the left leg below the knee, about 4:45 this morning. The man was immediately treated by doctors of the city emergency hospital, and then taken to St. Vincent's hospital in the police ambulance. He lived at 288 Third street and is 62 years old.

## Prohis will Merge With Progressives

St. Louis, April 12.—(I. N. S.)—A merger of the Progressive and Prohibition parties was unanimously endorsed late Thursday afternoon by the 125 delegates attending the Progressive party convention here. Final action on the matter will be taken by the national committee of both parties.

### Four Held at New York.

New York, April 12.—(I. N. S.)—Four more arrests were made here by federal officials Thursday in their roundup of alleged alien enemies. Hans Ehrt, a German, after being grilled several hours, made a confession that resulted in three more arrests. Officials withheld the names of the three, but one of them was said to be a German millionaire.

## GOVERNOR PAVES WAY TO STOP LEGISLATION IN BIG LAND ACTION

Effect of Latest Move May Be to End Suit Against the Pacific Livestock Co.

Salem, Or., April 12.—Governor Withycombe has formally requested Attorney General Brown officially to bring to the attention of the state land board the suit brought by the state against the Pacific Livestock company to recover about 20,000 acres in Harney county, alleged to have been obtained from the state fraudulently. The governor says to the attorney general:

"Submit to the board a written statement covering the situation and outlining your opinion as to what course you deem it proper for the state, through the board, to pursue. With this in hand, it will then rest with the board to take such action as

its members shall consider advisable." The governor is anxious to dismiss the suit. So is State Treasurer Kay, while Secretary of State Olcott, third member of the state land board, has adhered to the view that the board has nothing to do with the suit, as it was originally brought at the instance of the governor's office. The attorney general wants more funds with which to investigate the case, and has opposed the dismissal of the suit. While the governor wants to dis-

miss the suit, before he acts he wants Olcott and Kay to recommend dismissal. His request of the attorney general is considered to be a move to force the land board to assume responsibility in the matter, and then favor of dismissing the suit.
