UTAH HIGH JUMPER RECORD SHATTERER IN PENNSYLVANIA GAMES

Larsen Breaks Old Intercollegiate Mark of Richards With 6 Ft. 5 3/8 In. Leap.

WINNER IS DISQUALIFIED

Gauzsmuller Takes First in Century But A. A. U. Disqualifies Him—Penn Freshmen Set New Mile Record.

Philadelphia, April 28.—(I. N. S.)—Records were again smashed today in the University of Pennsylvania's athletic carnival.
In the running high jump, C. Larsen of Salt Lake City set a new American intercollegiate record with a jump of 5 feet 5 3/8 inches. The former mark was made by Alva Richards of Cornell, 5 feet 5 inches, and had stood since 1915.
In the mile, freshmen college race, the runners from the U. of P. checked up a new mark of 8:22, beating the old mark of 8:25 4-5, also set by a Pennsylvania team.
One disqualification marked the concluding day of the meet. In the 100 yard dash Gauzsmuller won but was disqualified because of being under suspension by the A. A. U.

Luckily for Walker the deal which sent him to Boston extra bases, as a member of the world's champion team. And "Tilly" is holding onto a job with both mitts these days. Last season Walker hit .265, which not considered terrific hitting for an outfielder by any means, but many of his hits were for extra bases.
