

GERMAN DESTROYER SUNK BY FLOTILLA OF BRITISH WAR SHIPS

Another Reported Damaged in Engagement at Long Distance Between Fleets.

OSTEND HEAVILY SHELLED

Good Results in Bombardment of Naval Base and Workshops Reported by British Admiralty.

London, June 5.—(U. P.)—A British light cruiser and destroyer flotilla sank one German destroyer, the S-20, and damaged another in an engagement with six enemy destroyers at long range, the admiralty reported today.
