

FOUR OF 7 MEASURES WIN SUPPORT FROM VOTERS AT THE POLLS

Measure for Consolidation of Elections Receives Favorable Majority of 33,482.

NEW PRISON IS HIT HARD

Proposed Limitation of Bills Receives Heaviest Adverse Vote, Losing by 61,127.

Four of the seven measures submitted to the people of Oregon at the special state election Monday carried three were rejected. With returns from all counties but Wheeler, the road bonds have a majority of 17,280.

With all counties heard from except Grant, Wheeler and Washington, the ship subsidy amendment has a majority of 12,583; the uniform tax classification measure a majority of 9,638, and the measure providing for the holding of city and state elections at the same time, a majority of 33,482.

Penitentiary Hard Hit The returns from all counties but Wheeler, Grant and Washington show a majority of 29,528 against the new penitentiary; 20,876 against the implied repeal of constitutional provisions, and 61,127 against the measure limiting bills that may be introduced before the legislature.

CHINA IS TORN AND MAY DIVIDE INTO TWO PARTS

As it looks today, a division of China into two nations is probable. The democrats of the southern provinces are more active in support of a central government than the people of the north.

The militarists object in the revolt is four-fold—first, abolition of the present provisional constitution; second, retirement of Li Yuan Hung; third, the establishment of a new government at Peking; fourth, a new parliament and a new constitution.

President Li Yuan Hung would retire if that action would benefit the country, but he considers that the masses of the Chinese people expect him to defend the democratic principles of the republic against the military dictatorship which is sure to come with establishment of a regency.

Japan Not to Interfere Tokyo, June 6.—(U. P.)—Japan will not interfere in any way in China's domestic troubles, the foreign office announced today.

Commission Is Appointed Tokyo, June 6.—(I. N. S.)—A high commission for dealing with diplomatic affairs has been organized here. It was stated today that the commission has resulted from the extraordinary conditions brought about by the revolutionary movements in China and Russia and the advent of the United States in the war.
