**Today's Forecast.**

**Weather Conditions.**  
An extensive pressure system overlies practically the entire country; the center of depression is over Saskatchewan, the barometric reading here at 10 A. M. this morning being 29.80 inches. The pressure is moderately high along the Pacific coast and elsewhere, have fallen in western Oregon, Washington, northwestern Montana, British Columbia, Alaska, Maine and the interior of the continent. The low pressure valley and along the Pacific coast, and the high pressure area over the western interior of the continent, is steadily heavy in central Iowa. The weather is cooler in western Oregon, Washington, northern California, and the southern Idaho states, low in Mississippi and the Gulf of Mexico and District of Columbia; it is warmer in practically all other sections of the country.

**Teamsters Are Organizing.**—Teamsters are being organized by representatives of the International Teamsters, and the organization includes drivers of all kinds, whether of teams or of motors. The teamsters were first organized in Portland in 1910 after a strike, and since then have barely held together. There are said to be over 300 of them here, but they have no organized craft union, with many companies in at every weekly meeting. The different divisions of teamsters, such as ice wagon drivers, white trunk and laundry drivers and others, are allowed to form separate unions, but act through a federation in the same manner as the drivers not in the federation belong to the American Federation of Labor.

**Kome Guard Drills.**—The Lippman Wolfe Welfare association has organized a home guard company classified as "Company H," first regiment, infantry. Drills are being held regularly in the Lippman-Wolfe armory, eighth floor of the department store. The officers are: Captain, H. Thompson; first lieutenant, W. B. Wolcott; second lieutenant, H. F. Cotton. The company was recruited by Sidney Mills, auditor of Lippman, Wolfe & Co.

**Girls Add to Fund.**—The girls of the Benson Polytechnic have raised \$23 from paper sales this term for the work of the Red Cross. Some of the late magazines were grouped and sold for the serial stories, thus obtaining a little more for them than for waste paper. They also solicited voluntary contributions and sold candy at different parties. Principal Miss Lillian Tingle sent the check to headquarters on Friday.

**Clothing Sale Aids Fund.**—Under the auspices of the Patriotic Conservation league a sale of men's suits and overcoats is being held at the new headquarters at Fourth and Burdette streets, about 75 of which have been collected in various parts of the city and were pressed and renovated by the Ennis Steam Cleaning and Dry works in charge. The garments range in price from \$2 to \$5. The sale will continue until about 9 o'clock, and the proceeds will be used for patriotic purposes.
