Rev. W. G. Elliot of Portland Will De-

Forest Grove, Or., June 9.—Rev. A. B. Patten, who came here recently from the First Congregational church at Sacramento, Cal., will deliver the baccalaureate sermon to the fifty-fifth graduating class of Pacific university Sunday morning and there will be special music. Sunday evening Rev. Warren Morse of Portland will deliver the address to the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A.

One of the big features of the college commencement will be the production of "Joan of Arc" with a chorus of 50 voices, starting three well known singers of Portland—Miss Goldie Peterson, soprano; Harry Miles Whetzel, tenor; and Harry Scougall, baritone. Corey Looks for Freight Rate Raise

Salem, Or., June 9.—That the Interstate Commerce commission will grant the railroads of the country an increase in freight rates is the opinion of H. H. Corey, a member of the Oregon Public Service commission, who with Secretary Edward Osterlander of the commission, returned today after attending the 15 per cent freight rate increase hearing just finished in Washington. Mr. Corey said he believes, however, that the Interstate Commerce commission will again suspend the proposed increased rates on western lumber, fruits and hops.

It was shown it would be disastrous to those industries to allow an increase in rates at this time," said Mr. Corey. He does not believe the commission will allow the full amount of increase requested by the railroads. Mr. Corey believes that the largest increase will be granted in what is known as the northeastern territory, the next largest in the southern territory, while the lowest increase will be in the western territory.

"Everyone looks for an early decision from the Interstate Commerce commission," he said. He presented a protest against any increase in rates in the west.

Rural Credit Bonds Taken

Salem, Or., June 9.—It was announced at the meeting of the state land board yesterday that \$200,000 more rural credit bonds had been taken. This brings the total up to \$450,000. It was decided at this meeting to limit to each county the sum of \$5000 in bonds and to each person the maximum of \$2000. The Ladd & Bush bank has taken \$50,000 of the bonds, the United States National bank, \$25,000, and the Capital National bank, \$25,000. The balance has been sold to the various banks of the state.

W. W. Laws Resigns

Vancouver, Wash., June 9.—The resignation of W. W. Laws as constable of Camas was filed with the county commissioners today. A petition was also presented asking that A. H. Kersey be appointed to fill the vacancy, but no action was taken. Mr. Laws has been appointed as a deputy in the sheriff's office.

Jamison Ranch Is Sold for \$90,000

Black Butte Livestock Company, Represented by C. A. Farvin, Portland, Makes the Purchase at Bend.

Bend, Or., June 9.—The Black Butte Livestock company, represented by C. A. Farvin of Portland today purchased the well known W. J. Jamison ranch lying in Lake and Klamath counties, comprising about 9000 acres, for a consideration of \$90,000. In the deal is included 3000 head of sheep, 64 head of horses and mules and farm machinery.

A. J. Kronert, president manager of the Bend Flour Mill company, today became part owner in the lumber interests of the Gardner Wilkinson Lumber company, purchasing the interests of R. R. Gardner of Portland. Mr. Kronert states that considerable improvements will be made in the recently constructed plant as soon as possible.

Crop Outlook Is Good

Bend, Or., June 9.—Central Oregon crop outlook in every line is most encouraging, according to S. L. Wiggins of the O-W. R. & N., who has just returned from an extensive tour of inspection in all the farm districts tributary to Bend. The fall sown grain in the country to the north is beginning to head and the spring sown grain is up and prospering.

Mill Will Add Saw

Bend, Or., June 9.—Just as soon as it is proved that the railroads are able to handle the output, the Shovel-Hixon company will add a fourth band to its local sawmill, according to E. L. Carpenter, representative of the Shovel-Hixon interests, who is in Bend today. Another Raise for Workers

Oregon City, June 9.—By a still further increase given to its employees today, the Crown Williamette Paper company will pay out an additional \$2000 a month, the increase taking effect as of June 1. Speaking of the change, which annuls the bonus announced a couple of months ago and by which the men were getting from 25 cents to 50 cents a day over their regular wages, Manager McEldin stated

that every employee, from the lowest paid to the highest, will receive a uniform increase of 50 cents a day. Under the former bonus plan the \$5 a day men only received 25 cents bonus, while the \$2.40 a day men received 50 cents bonus.

Fourth Celebration Planned
