evening drew on, however, the pace picked up so that probably the bulk of the voting came between the dinner hour and the closing time at 8 o'clock.

At the last election about 3500 votes were cast for school director, the law at that time restricting the suffrage to those who were property owners.

The legislature of 1917, however, removed the property qualification, so that the entire number of voters within the district qualified to vote at a general election could have cast their ballots had they so desired.

Light Vote Explained
This year there were 82 election precincts against 49 at the election of two years ago, as a result of which it is expected that the total count will be completed in almost as short a space of time as the smaller totals were compiled heretofore.

The light vote cast is accounted for by School Clerk Thomas, and others who have been following the course of the directors' campaign, by the fact that the election came so close on the heels of the special state and the municipal election, and also because the school fight was overshadowed during the last three days by the Rose Festival and its varied entertainments. Still, it is believed that the general voter has not yet discovered that the old property ownership restriction has been repealed so that the right to vote at school elections is now held by all citizens of the state.

CROWN PRINCE FAILS TO DISLODGE BRITISH BY LARGE OFFENSIVE

Germans Who Reach Front Trenches Are Either Killed or Driven Out.

FRENCH REPULSE ATTACK

In Turn They Make Successful Raid on German Trenches East of Rheims, Retaining With Prisoners.

London, June 16.—(I. N. S.)—The Bavarian crown prince tried hard in the last 24 hours to regain his grip on the eastern fortified positions of Meuse ridge. After a heavy bombardment he threw large offensives against the British below the Ypres-Comines canal.

"A few Germans, who succeeded in reaching our front trenches," said the British headquarters report, "were at once killed or driven out, and the attack was completely repulsed at all points."

Equally fruitless, according to the Paris communique, were German attacks on the Verdun front, near Hill 264 and two high points of the Meuse, as well as east of Badonville.

The French on their part made a successful raid on German trenches to the east of Rheims. They returned with prisoners. Artillery duels continued around Craonne and near Montcornet. In these two sectors the Germans have been bombarding the French lines for more than a week. Infantry attacks were on a larger scale than looked for.

Petrograd today reported a successful Russian surprise attack of a local nature. Aerial activity continues brisk along the eastern front. Russian gun-fire brought down a German flyer near Stokhol.

Today's Vienna war statement tells of extremely violent Italian cannonading on the Catinian front. It also reports increased fighting on the Austro-Russian fronts in eastern Galicia and Volhynia.
