### General Chairman Ayer Well Pleased With Generous Response Which Solicitors Receive From People.

Smalling all previous records, team today in Portland's \$200,000 Red Cross drive reported donations amounting to \$48,493, which, added to the home to house canvass report, makes grand total of \$186,792.

### Big Crowd Gathers Along the Front of White House to Watch Proceedings.

Washington, June 21.—(U. P.)—Screaming "traitors," an angry mob led by Mrs. Dea Richardson attacked the suffrage pickets at both the west and east gates of the White House this afternoon, ripping down their yellow banners and tramping them in the street.

Police reserves were called out to quell the rioting, in which several thousand persons were engaged. The rioting was confined to the front of the White House gates for months.

## RUSSIA WILL START DRIVE TO WIN WAR

### Congress of Workers and Soldiers, Representing Entire Nation, Resolves Unanimously to Begin Immediately Offensive in East.

## APOLOGY OFFERED FOR LONG DELAYED ACTION

Allies Are Asked to Charitably Consider Difficulties Encountered During Task of Consolidating Newly Won Liberties.

Petrograd, June 21.—(U. P.)—The "all Russia congress of workers and soldiers" today unanimously resolved upon an immediate Russian offensive.

The unanimous vote indicates that even the Petrograd council of workmen's and soldiers' delegates, which has heretofore been strongly in favor of peace, has been won over to the war side, in view of the overwhelming sentiment to that end developed by the all Russian conference.

The Petrograd local council has heretofore assumed a place of national importance, but with the assembling of delegates from all over the nation it is now completely overshadowed. Another evidence of crystallization of sentiment that Russia should fight and fight at once was given today in a manifesto by the military union of women volunteers.

"The workers are appealing for an unrelenting struggle against an enemy who is moved solely by imperialistic and slaving tendencies. We ask our allies to charitably consider Russia's difficulties and..."
