

MUCH TRAVELED TEXAN FINDS NO SCENERY SO FINE AS IS OREGON'S

John H. Stephens of Wichita Falls Says Portland Is Due to See Great Prosperity.

COTTON FARMERS RICH

Business Improving Everywhere, Reports Former Democratic Member of Congress.

"I have visited every state in the union with the exception of Maine and Florida and I've been to almost all the scenic points in the country by automobile, but I find Oregon to be the greatest beauty spot I have ever seen. The trip through the residence section here is far superior to the famous one of Kansas City."

This is the opinion of John H. Stephens of Wichita Falls, Tex., former Democratic representative in the house from Shelby county, Texas. During the short time he has been here he has visited many points of interest in Multnomah county and has been for a trip up the Columbia river, planning to make the Columbia river highway trip next week.

Awakening Here Predicted

"I've never before been able to see so many snow-capped mountains at one time as from Council Crest, and at that point there is an unusual display of agriculture in the Tualatin valley on one side and commerce and industries on the other side in the Willamette valley."

"There is every indication of the growth of wonderful shipbuilding industries here. I don't see why you haven't a material advantage over Seattle. Seattle is at a great disadvantage owing to the fact that all its iron and steel must be handled over two ranges of mountains. The big thing that Portland needs is to be waked up. I think your people have got rich and gone to sleep. You are waking up now. Business seems to run in cycles, and you have just passed your period of depression. The way you handled the Liberty Loan and Red Cross fund is something to be proud of."

Cotton Farmers Growing Rich
"Business is improving all over the country. The banks in Texas are filled with money. Cotton there is drawing the high price of \$185 a bale. Farmers who used to walk to town now ride in automobiles, and my county just recently voted several hundred thousand dollars for road bonds to cooperate with the government, though the rest of the state did not."

Mr. Stephens was a representative in the house from Shelby county, Texas, during the fifty-fifth to fifty-eighth congresses. He is visiting Mr. and Mrs. George M. Sawyer of 122 East Eighteenth street north, owing to the illness of Mrs. Stephens, a native of Oregon. Mr. Stephens has the distinction of having served on the Indian committee in congress longer than any other man, and he was chairman of the committee for several sessions. He introduced the bill which made Oklahoma a state.

No More Civilians Can Be Officers

After Next Camp, Training Camp Applications Must Come From Men Already in the Service.

San Francisco, June 28.—(P. N. S.) Those wishing to join the second reserve officers' training camp, which will open August 27 at the Presidio, may send their applications by mail. This is the last chance civilians will have to become reserve officers.

All questions must be answered in full, the answers must be sworn to before a notary, and a physician's certificate must accompany the application.

Until further notice, the committee to receive applications will be in session beginning tomorrow. Hereafter training camp applications must come from men already enlisted in the regulars, the national guard or the national army.

Newberg, Or., June 28.—Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Hollingsworth of this city celebrated their fifty-second wedding anniversary Tuesday. The bride of 52 years ago served a dinner to 16 guests. Among those present were Mr. and Mrs. Jack Roberts of Portland, Mrs. Roberts and Mrs. Hollingsworth are sisters and the Roberts were present at the wedding over a half century ago.

Mr. and Mrs. Hollingsworth were married near Indiana, Iowa, in 1865, and they moved to Oregon in 1870. They spent one winter here, removed to Washington where they lived for 28 years. They returned to Oregon and lived in the city of Portland five years. Mr. Hollingsworth is 77 years old and his wife is 74.
