

VALUE OF VISITING TEACHER DESCRIBED BY N. E. A. SPEAKER

Movement Said to Represent Attempt of Volunteer Helper to Individual Child.

In his address on the "Exceptional Child and the Visiting Teacher," D. D. Johnson, assistant professor of education of the University of Washington, said before the department of special education of the N. E. A. as follows: "The visiting teacher movement represents one of the most recent attempts on the part of the volunteer helper to socialize the school through coordinating it with the home and with other cooperative agencies of the community. It is an attempt to individualize the child through socializing the school."

"The young science of sociology has of recent years come to the aid of the educational engineer—the practical administrator. Educational sociology is giving to administration the social perspective which it has been so long lacking. Administrative officers are gaining what Dr. Suzzallo has so aptly called "the window-viewpoint." They are learning not only to welcome but also to seek the volunteer helper with his enthusiasm and willing hands, and to encourage every cooperative agency in the community to bring aid to the schools.

"The visiting teacher brings no new activities or studies, such as spelling, vocational education, plays and games, etc. These activities are for the most part already available, with modifications for the children whom the visiting teacher serves. The visiting teacher represents an improved technique in securing an improved performance of these activities for a certain type of exceptional child. "The visiting teacher 'cases' are recruited from the ranks of the over-age retarded children and the majority of them come from homes in which conditions are socially or economically adverse. "In most places the status of the visiting teacher is entirely unofficial in so far as the school system is concerned. She is left in the position of one who is permitted to tamper with the schools. Parent-teacher associations, boards of health, private subscriptions, public education associations, and other cooperative agencies are supporting the work. "As time passes it may be predicted that these volunteer helpers, for such they are at present in the main, will more and more demonstrate their social and educational worth. They will then receive official recognition by the boards of education and be paid out of the common school fund. At present this movement deserves and needs the encouragement of everyone greatly interested in educational progress."

Defects in Speech Topic at the N. E. A.

Methods of Prevention Discussed by Walter B. Swift, Who Urges Correct Enunciation Standards.
"How to Prevent Speech Defects in the Public Schools," was the subject of an address at the N. E. A. convention by Walter B. Swift, Harvard graduate school of medicine, Boston, Mass., who said: "Prevention is the proper procedure in every medical field today. New medical fields are entered with no conception of what and of vegetables as a substitute for meat." "Dr. Van Hise, who is president of the University of Wisconsin, strongly indicated that it is the national intention to secure the above modifications in the eating habits of the people through cooperation, if possible, if not, through regulation. He had been in business in this city for over 25 years.

President Gilman Returns Resident of Tiller Loses Life in River

Roseburg, Or., July 13.—James Brown, a resident of Tiller, but lately employed by B. K. Lawson, formerly superintendent of the penitentiary, on his big ranch, at Round Prairie, was drowned in the South Umpqua river, near here Wednesday night. Brown had gone to the river for a swim after a day's work and probably took a cramp. Two persons were with him when he went into the river, but they left soon, and it was not discovered that he was gone until Thursday morning. The body was recovered. He was about 60 years old, and had lived in Douglas county nearly all his life.

SPELLING MADE EASY BY METHOD OFFERED BY H. P. LEE OF BOISE

Original System of Grouping Phonetically Inconsistent Words, Proves Big Aid.

Among the visiting members of the N. E. A. is H. P. Lee of Boise, who is the author of a new spelling book entitled, "A Systematic Key to English Pronunciation and Spelling." The work which is original in character, contains a systematic list of all the phonetically inconsistent spellings, and under the head of each of these are listed all the words in the English language having such spelling. For example, in words of one syllable, the sound "oo" is spelled with "u" only in "put, pull, full, push, bull, bush and ugh." Mr. Lee says: "It is surprising how few groups there are and how few words there are in most groups. Four fifths of English words are phonetically consistent in their spelling. The book is based on the idea that it is illogical to try to teach a pupil to spell a word by letter that he cannot pronounce distinctly and correctly, divide into syllables and spell by sound."
