Food Preserving Methods

Directions Presented Here Are Supplied by the Government Bulletins From the Department of Agriculture and by the Experts of the Oregon Agricultural college at Corvallis.

ARTICLE 11—STEPS IN COLD PACK CANNING
Some of the steps in canning by the cold pack method have previously been described—absolute cleanliness of products, utensils and hands and the elimination of all decayed spots.

After the materials have been cleaned and put into the shape in which they are to be canned and test-tainers have been cleaned and tested, the canning procedure for most products by the one-period cold-pack method consists of five steps—scalding, blanching, cold-dipping, packing, processing and sealing.

The products to be canned are blanched or scalded usually by being placed in a cheesecloth bag or dipping basket into boiling water and allowed to remain there from one to 15 minutes, depending on the kind of product.

The product should be packed carefully into hot jars as soon as removed in case of fruits, boiling hot sirup or hot water is then added. In the case of vegetables, hot water usually is used and salt is added for seasoning.

bleach or darken if exposed to light. It is well, therefore, to wrap jars in paper. From time to time, especially during very hot weather, both glass jars and tin cans should be examined to make certain there are no leaks, swellings or other signs of fermentation.
