

CHIEF JOHNSON PUTS END TO THE BEAVERS' FINE WINNING STREAK

Seal Hurler Succeeds in Holding
Portland Safe in One
of Sunday's Double Bill.

It took all the native cunning of that Vernon callout, Chief No-Shirt Johnson, to break the winning streak of the Beavers and the Seals managed to win the second game of the doubleheader yesterday, 5 to 3. Off Lynn Brenton, the hardluck hurler. Just previous to that Bill Fincher had held the Seals to four hits and one run, while his mates played merry-go-round with C. Adrian Baum, gathering 13 bingles and eight runs.

Chief of those who had the number of C. Adrian Baum making it six out of seven games for the series were Paddy Siglin, who had a perfect day, and Pinelli, who had three infield and one outfield sacrifices. Also one who added mightily to his batting average was Charles Hollocher, who gathered a triple, a double and four singles in eight times up off the Seal slabs.

Portland got away in the lead in the first game with two runs in the opener on Holly's single, Pinelli's sacrifice, Willie's walk, Williams' single and scored Holly and caused Willie to get caught at third, Williams' steal and Downs' error on Horton's groundball that brought the Beaver centerfielder home.

Griggs' single, his stolen base and Siglin's single added another in the fourth. Yet another was made in the fifth on Hollocher's single to right, Pinelli's sacrifice, Willie's out and Williams' drive past third.

The Seals played their lone ace in the sixth, when Fitzgerald singled, too second time in the series to right and scored when Griggs dropped Schaller's fly.

Hollocher's walk, sacrifices by Pinelli and Willie, Williams' single and Horton's double to right, gave two in the seventh and another pair were added in the eighth on Siglin's double to left, Fisher's out, Fincher's single to right, Hollocher's double to center and put the pitcher on third, and Pinelli's long sacrifice to Schaller.

Fincher was not responsible for the lone run of the Seals and pitched a great game of ball.

In the second game the Beavers made a noise like a clean sweep, but could not hold up. Willie's double to center and Williams' smash past first, brought in the tally.

Seals Draw Ahead in Third
Brenton held the Seals down until the third, when they drew ahead for the first time in the series. Pinelli walked, but was forced by Johnson. Fitzgerald doubled to the right field fence, placing the chief on third, while the score was 2 to 0.

Hollocher started bombardment
Hollocher tripled to left center and Pinelli doubled to right. Willie was called out on strikes and Williams fouled to Fitzgerald. Horton walked and Griggs hit a long double to right center that brought in another runner and was nabbed at the plate on perfect throws, Calvo to Downs to Baker.

Oldham had been limbering up in the "bullpen," after that the Chief didn't give the Beavers a look-in. For good measure the Seals made another in the eighth on Schaller's double down the right field chalkline, a passed ball and Downs' out, Brenton to Horton.
