

MACHINE GUN FIRE IS ONE OF MAIN STUDIES IN TRAINING SAMMIES

Eight Hours Minimum of Intensive Work Behind Line; French Methods Studied.

 Generosity Proves Embarrassing
 American Training Camp in France, July 19.—(U. N. S.)—The generosity of the French has put the American army officials in a quandary.
 In addition to the gifts of ham and jam to the "Sammies" on Bastille day the French have presented the Americans with one quart of champagne for every four men and a half of a litre of red wine for each man as an expression of friendship.
 The American officials, while appreciating deeply the spirit of the gift were undecided how to act.
 They have been unable to conclude whether or not to give the wine to the men.

Permanent Training Camp of the American Expeditionary Army, July 19.—(U. P.)—A minimum of eight hours a day is school day for the American Sammies in their intensive training for the fighting front.
 The study given most attention is machine gun fire. Practice with this weapon is featured in the daily program.

Major General Sibert, commandant of the camp, with his staff, is putting in long hours daily studying French methods of field operations. A coordination of the two systems is expected to yield best results.

American motorcycles, used by dispatch riders, are having their troubles on French roads. Today it was said every motorcycle had averaged four punctures a day from the hobnails since arriving.
