

ARMY WILL ESTABLISH ARTILLERY SCHOOL TO INSTRUCT SPECIALISTS

Civilians Invited to Apply to Commander of Western Department for Positions.

GOOD SALARIES PROVIDED

Applicants Asked to Supply Recommendations and to Specify as to Their Fitness for Places.

Fort Winfield Scott, at San Francisco, is to be the setting for a school to develop enlisted specialists for the coast artillery.

Applicants Should Apply Direct

Civilians from Oregon, California, Washington, Montana, Idaho, Wyoming and Utah may apply for entrance through an application direct to the commanding general of the western department of the army at San Francisco.

School Opens August 1

Applications sent to the western department commander should be accompanied by letters of recommendation.

Major C. H. Hilton, coast artillery corps, adjutant of the south Pacific army district, believes that a large number of exceptionally well qualified civilians from this and other states will be anxious to attend the Fort Scott school.
