Diagnosticians See in Febrile Tendency Alarming Symptoms of Rival Serums.

DR. HOLT STORM CENTER

Pending Meeting of Board, September 1, Relief From Situation Over Robberg Succession Is Unlikely.

Diagnosticians who have been feeling the pulse of the state board of health since its eruption of last week became visible, express the opinion that the high temperature of the patient is due primarily to anaphylaxis occasioned by the injection of two opposing political serums in the body of the board at the same time.

DANIELS ASKS HEAD OF NAVY LEAGUE TO RESIGN PRESIDENCY

Attack on Department's Conduct of Mare Island Blast Inquiry Is Resented. OTHERS ARE ASKED TO GO

League Statement Called Malicious Attempt to Discredit Department Trying to Fix Responsibility.

Washington, Aug. 15.—(I. N. S.)—Immediate resignation of Colonel Robert M. Thompson and other active officers of the Navy league is requested in a letter sent out to Colonel Thompson by Secretary of the Navy Daniels.

Secretary Daniels prefaces his request on the alleged falsity of a statement put out by the Navy league intimating that the investigation of the explosion of the Mare Island shipyard in July has been held up by orders from navy officials, acting under the influence exerted by powerful labor interests.

Malice Is Charged "The attention of the public is invited to the deliberate attempt of the responsible agent of the Navy league to publish a statement, which, even if true, should not have been given out without reference to the department."
