

CONSULTATION OF ALL ALLIES WILL PRECEDE PEACE NOTE ANSWER

Disposition in Some Quarters Is to Leave Answer to President Wilson.

London, Aug. 17.—(U. P.)—The allies will not reply to the peace proposition in the form of a note until after consultation in which all the entente powers will have a part.

At the same time there is some disposition in certain quarters to leave the answer to President Wilson.

The statement that all of the entente nations and their allies will be consulted before a reply to the German note is decided on, was made by Lord Robert Cecil today.

Washington, Aug. 17.—(U. P.)—President Wilson's cabinet will voice its views on the peace note at today's cabinet session.

There is strong disposition, however, to have the president make America's position and aims in the war plainly known to the world.

The world looks to Wilson's decision as the real decision of the whole situation. The allies, now dependent on the united states for physical and financial aid, are virtually compelled to follow his course.

Conferees with the allied governments have been going on for several days. Persons with a general knowledge of the secretary Lansing's past few days have been refused a definite announcement of policy.

The paramount element of the situation, however, is the fact that millions of Catholics in the world will listen earnestly to the pope's plea and that doubtless this will prove the leaven working for an earlier peace than might have come had the pontiff not spoken.

Germans Not All Pleased. Amsterdam, Aug. 17.—(U. P.)—Despite the view of the allied press that the peace proposal of Pope Benedict is German in character, it is not quite pro-German enough to suit a portion of the German press.

The Legal Anzeiger today warns Germany to remain composed. The pope only mentioned one of Germany's essential terms, the paper stated that concerning her colonies—and this is unsatisfactory.

Catholic papers congratulate the pope on his initiative. Others are divided, either making no comment, taking a position in opposition to that of the Lokal Anzeiger or advising that the pontiff's appeal be given careful consideration.

Pope Is Greatly Depressed. Rome, Aug. 17.—(U. P.)—Pope Benedict is reported to be greatly depressed over the general unfavorable reception accorded his appeal for peace.

Air Raiders Damage German Stations

London, Aug. 17.—(I. N. S.)—Heavy damage has been inflicted by British aircraft upon aerodromes, railway lines and military depots behind the German lines in Belgium.

Tons of explosives were dropped and fires were seen to break out at Ostend, at Thourout and at the aviation station at Ghellette.

At times the air-men flew so low they could see their machine guns against the German soldiers on the ground beneath them.

Paris, Aug. 17.—(By Agency Radio to N. S.)—Great aerial activity is reported from the Balkan front.

The war office announced today that 23 French and five Italian aviators had destroyed enemy camps in the region of Pogograd while British aircraft bombed Bulgarian military depots at Seres.

The statement added that there have been intermittent artillery actions along the whole Macedonian front with patrol combats on the Struma river and between Lake Ochrida and Lake Prespa.
