Columbia Highway Will Be Closed to Traffic Sept. 10th

Hood River, Or., Sept. 5.—It is understood that the Columbia river highway will be closed on September 10 between the Multnomah county line and Cascade Locks, in order to permit grading.
Arrangements have been made for moving the stores and dwelling houses on the east side of Cascade Locks, in the line of the survey made by the state highway engineer.
Hood River county court will probably take steps to condemn a right-of-way through orchard tracts on the east side of Hood River for the highway on the route leading over Mosier Hill.

SEATTLE SYNDICATE BUYS OLD JOSEPHINE PLACER PROPERTIES

Logan Holdings, Near Waldo, Go to Northern Men, Who Promise Big Development.

Grants Pass, Or., Sept. 5.—The largest mining sale in Josephine county of recent years was closed Tuesday when a deed to the famous Logan placer property, situated two miles northwest of Waldo, passed from James Logan and his family to George M. Esterly, an Alaskan placer mine operator, and a group of Seattle associates.
The property has been a steady producer for many years. It was discovered in the early fifties when Jacksonville was enjoying her boom. During recent years the property has been turning out about \$50,000 annually.
The new owners announce that they will at once enlarge the water supply canal to an extent which will allow the washing of 10 times the material now handled, making the annual production half a million. The property is exceptionally easy of handling, having no cement and no large boulders.
