

JAPAN STRIVES FOR SAME IDEALS AS U. S., SAYS CONSUL

Akamatsu and Wife Are Hosts at Dinner at Hotel Multnomah in Honor of Birthday of the Mikado.

Governor Withycombe and Senator Chamberlain Are Among Speakers—Flags of Two Nations Entwined.

How the people of America and the people of Japan are working toward ideals of democracy almost identical have only in the form was related Wednesday night at the Multnomah hotel by S. Akamatsu, imperial Japanese consul for Portland, at a dinner given in celebration of the birthday of the mikado. The consul and Mrs. Akamatsu were hosts.

The assemblage was representative of the friendly spirit which today exists between the people of America and the people of Japan. Consul Akamatsu, in proposing a toast to the president of the United States, assured his guests that the Japanese were heartily with the United States in the war against the kaiser. The response was made by Governor Withycombe, who gave a toast "to the emperor." Other speakers were Senator Chamberlain, William D. Wheelwright, Bishop W. T. Sumner and Justice Wallace McCamant.

Japan Fighting Autocracy
Consul Akamatsu referred to Americans as "friends and neighbors of Japan."

"Japan is a simple country," said the consul in his speech. "The nation has grown out of a family and even now it can be said it is nothing but a large family. The emperor, being the lineal descendant of our common ancestor, is considered, according to our usage, as the natural ruler of the whole nation in the same sense that a father is the natural ruler of his family. You do not elect your father in your family; so we do not elect our emperor in our country. You cannot change your father; so we cannot change our emperor. Our imperial house is over 2500 years old. It is older than the nation itself. No dynasty can last long unless it has such a special relation with the people, and this special relation is the secret of the success of its long continuation in the future."

"The Japanese people will have their emperor as long as the nation lasts, but you do not elect him. I told you we have no sympathy with an autocratic government—nay, we are fighting against it. No autocratic government shall survive in the present world war. What I like to have you understand is that in Japan a very democratic government and a throne can exist at the same time."

"Not only the Japanese people, but the emperor himself have learned to admire, and are endeavoring to adopt the American idea of democracy. In the past there have been some misapprehensions and misunderstandings between your people and mine, but they have been largely the results of the activities of the German agencies in both countries. The German kaiser had been long endeavoring to create a war between Japan and the United States. Having this object in view he invented all kinds of bugaboos concerning Japan."

"Though such were received by the public with little credence and need, all were proved groundless, the reputation seemed to create a subconscious suspicion among Americans. Then came the final masterpiece of Herr Zimmerman, who planned an alliance between Japan and Mexico against America. We simply laughed at it. Herr Zimmerman was sorry. But thank God, the stupid Germans are gradually coming to their senses. According to a telegram from Copenhagen, which appeared in local papers a few days ago, a German military critic is warning his readers that they no longer have the right to count upon a future war between Japan and the United States."

Senator George E. Chamberlain evoked hearty applause when he expressed the belief that the war will be brought to a victorious conclusion through the cooperation of the forces of Japan and the United States in attacking Germany and her allies from the south and southeast. He called attention to the reports from London and Paris that the Austro-German successes on the Italian front would compel important changes in the plans of the allies. It seems highly probable, said the senator, that the new plan of campaign may provide for a mighty offensive in which the armies of America and Japan will strike with overwhelming force at Germany's back-door."

Two Flags Are Blended
Educational cooperation between American and Japanese students in the great universities was discussed by Bishop W. T. Sumner.

Justice Wallace McCamant of the Oregon supreme court spoke on "The Allies." In his address he dwelt upon the common aims of the allies in the fight against Prussian aggression. That Germany has long since "lost its soul and that Japan was finding its fullest development of the national heart," was the declaration of William D. Wheelwright. He reviewed the Prussian system from early periods to the present day.

The affair was enlivened by American and Japanese national airs. The colors of the two nations were used in the decorations.
