

CHARTERS FIXED FOR LUMBER FROM NORTHERN PORTS

Movement Will Be Brisk in Next Few Months to West Coast and to Australian Ports From America.

Four Hundred Thousand Cases of Salmon Still Await Shipment From Canneries in Alaska.

The shipment of lumber from North Pacific points during the next few months will be brisk.

It is estimated by the steamship lines that there are about 400,000 cases of salmon of the past season packed yet to be shipped from southeastern Alaska canneries.
