Minneapolis Bank Robbed of \$5000

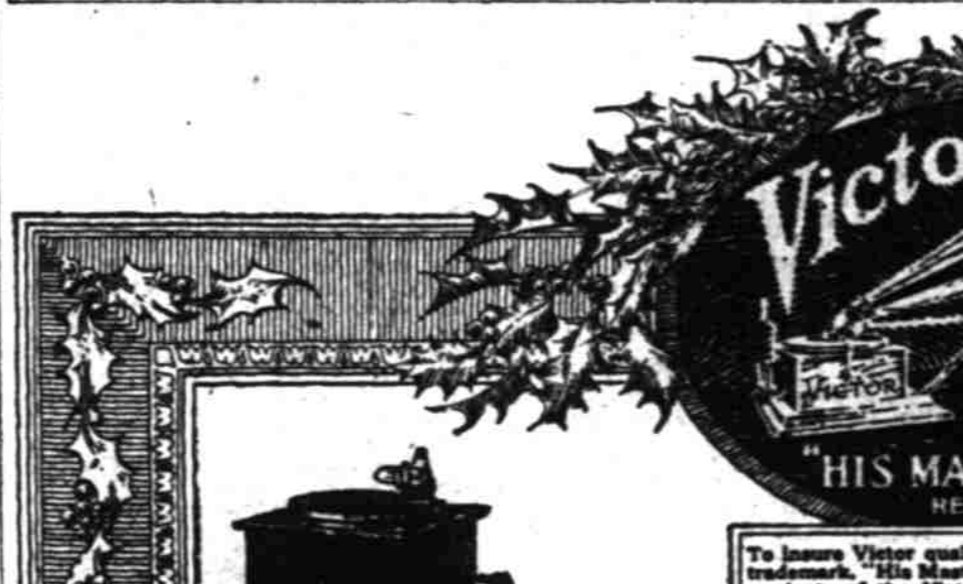
Minneapolis, Dec. 22.—(I. N. S.)—Three auto bandits held up the People's State bank here today and escaped with \$5000.

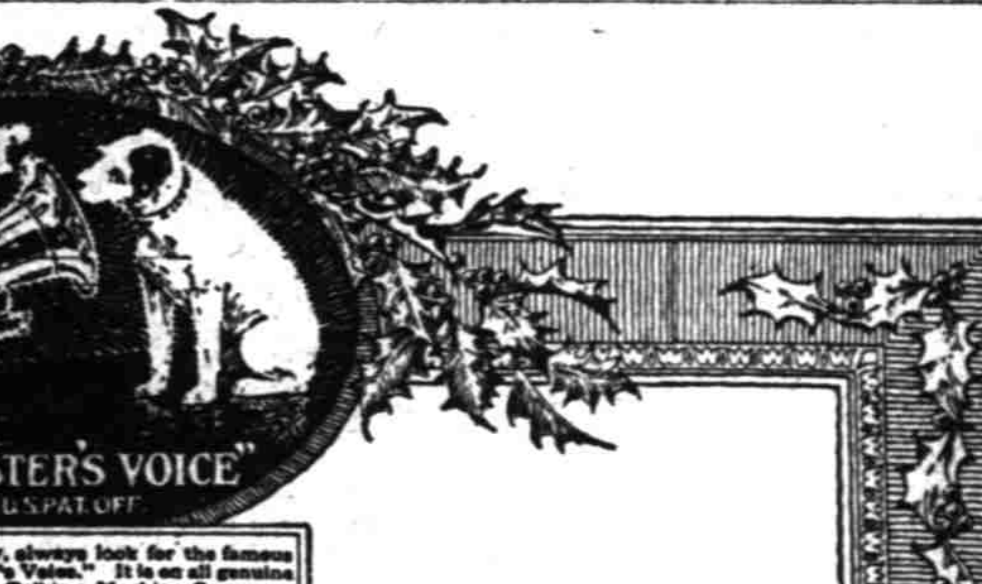
