

FOREST WORKERS AS TRUE SOLDIERS AS ANY IN ARMY

Col. Disque Extends Greetings
to Those Who Are Swinging
Ax for Victory and Democracy.

DAY LOST IS AID TO KAISER

Uniforms in Spruce Camps Will
Be Reminder That Uncle Sam
Realizes Importance of Work.

Keep the ax swinging for America
and democracy is the key note of the
New Year's greetings of Colonel Bruce
P. Disque, of the United States Signal
corps, to the 25,000 members of the
Loyal Legion of Loggers and Lumbermen.

"You are soldiers of the flag just as
truly as the boys, who, knee-deep in
the mud of France, are stopping the bullets
of the enemy. And by the strength of your
blows and the loyalty of your hearts
will this war be won."

Such is Colonel Disque's message to
the toilers of the forests of spruce and
the lumber and logging operators. Col-
onel Disque further sets forth the patri-
otic significance of the loyal legion.

German Labor Enforced
He pictures a striking contrast be-
tween the methods used by the Kaiser's
servants in getting out spruce for air-
planes and those of Uncle Sam.

"Germany is obtaining airplane ma-
terial by enforced labor in the invaded
Russian forests on the Baltic which do
not belong to her. Thousands of help-
less prisoners are driven to work at the
point of the bayonet from early dawn
until dark."

"What a splendid service the loyal
legion may thus perform, exemplifying
the loyalty and honesty and the un-
flinching labor over the mangled labor of
the Kaiser. Show this red despot the
efficiency of labor in the land of the
free where men know the meaning of
'ought' instead of 'must'."

The following is Colonel Disque's plea
for unity and loyalty contained in the
message which has been sent to the
secretary of each legion chapter:
"Your government asks you to pro-
duce 11,000,000 feet of spruce each month.
Also, it asks you to make up the deficiency
of the last month within a week. When an
average of only 3,000,000 feet was ob-
tainable."

Day Off Is Work for Kaiser
"Every detail of our government's
aircraft plan has been executed ac-
cording to the present program save
only the most essential, that of produc-
ing the timber when it is needed. We
must produce this stock not only for
our own machines but for the allies as well."

"This high duty falls upon you and
me, and we need the moral and physical
aid and encouragement of every person
in the spruce section. General
Squier has said, 'The Northwest is the
neck of the bottle in this war.'"

"Armies today must be supported by
coordinating industrial and military
efforts. Without the other, the
Northwest, men and women, em-
ployer and employee, member and non-
member of the loyal legion, comprise
an industrial and moral army for the
specific purpose of speeding up the pro-
duction of spruce. A day's lay-off is
two days' work for the Kaiser."

"This division is sending troops to
help you in this work. Their uniforms
will serve as a constant reminder that
your country regards your duty in the
forests equally as urgent and important
as that of the soldiers in the trenches.
A dozen axes in the northwest forests
may prove to be worth more than a
regiment of rifles in France."

Enemy Spreading Poison
"At the front soldiers would be shot
as deserters if they laid down their
rifles and ran away. But American sol-
diers are never guilty of such deeds, nor
will I feel sure, any member of the
Loyal Legion lay down his axe and aid
the enemy by running away."

"It is a part of your duties to aid your
more credulous brother members in re-
sisting the malign whisperings of ene-
mies in your camps and in the trenches.
No heed to the nonsense that you are sig-
nifying away any of your constitutional
rights by taking the legion's pledge of
loyalty."

"Such stories are enemy stories, the
work of spies and traitors. Your pledge
to the government leaves you as free
a citizen as you were before signing
and the pledge is only a visible and tan-
gible evidence of a loyalty which you
gave prior to signing."

"The headquarters of this division
looks to you to prevent all acts of
sabotage and sedition on the part of
employer, employee or others. This duty
your government expects of you, to pre-
vent 'aid or comfort to the enemy' in
any way."
