

DEMOCRATS SEND WILSON MESSAGE OF LOYAL SUPPORT

Resolution Is Passed at Meeting Presided Over by National Committeeman H. M. Esterly.

BAKER IS ALSO SUPPORTED

Opponents of Administration Are Criticized; War Aims Are Fully Indorsed.

Democrats of Oregon, at a meeting in Portland Wednesday night, presided over by H. M. Esterly, Democratic national committeeman from this state, drafted a resolution and forwarded it to President Wilson assuring him of their loyal support of his war aims. Following is the resolution:

"We believe the citizens of Oregon, at least partly, understand the enormous difficulties you have had to meet, and we believe, though it has been impossible to develop and equip millions of men, and please in every instance, and some mistakes have been made, on the whole you and your executive associates have met your problems with a promptness and efficiency greater than any of the allies in their first entry into the war, and no country has been free from mistakes.

Differences Are Regretted
"We remember that before our entry into the war our full energies and resources were devoted to supplying the allies and that you were impeded by pre-existing laws and conditions beyond your control. We deeply regret any differences of opinion as to your plan between you and your supporters and advisers, but feel such differences should be fully discussed in private between you, as head of the nation, and your constitutional helpers and advisers, so that public unofficial adverse criticism by members of the government is hurtful to the cause of the war and tends to encourage the enemy.

"We fully indorse your noble statement of our war aims as a crusade for real and true democracy for the peoples of the world and to this we pledge you our loyal support."

Baker Also Commended
Following the meeting, Esterly forwarded the following telegram to Secretary Baker:

"Hon. Newton D. Baker, Secretary of War, Washington, D. C.: Your capable and high minded administration of military affairs, under most difficult circumstances and conditions, is warmly appreciated and approved by many thoughtful citizens of my acquaintance, and I think the people of Oregon generally have entire confidence in your wisdom and ability, notwithstanding recent hostile criticism."

Canada May Take Over Paper Plants

Inability of Canadian Press Association and Manufacturers to Come Together Is Reason—Effect on U. S. Uncertain.
Ottawa, Ont., Jan. 24.—(I. N. S.)—It was reported in government circles today that the Canadian government would take over a sufficient number of paper mills in the dominion to furnish Canadian newspapers with the needed supply of newsprint, on account of the seeming impossibility of the Canadian Press association and the manufacturers of newsprint coming together and adjusting their differences as to price.
The government has the authority under the war measures act to do this and to fix the price of paper. It is not certain whether this action would effect the exporting of newsprint to the United States.
