WEATHER CONDITIONS Two important areas of low pressure are apparent this morning, one centered in Saskatchevan and one off the extreme north Pacific coast. High pressure prevails over the remainder of the country, the highest readings being in Oklabous. Precipitation has occurred on the north Pacific coast and at a few widely scattered places in other sections. The weather is milder over most of the Northwest, the rise in temperature having been most rapid in northern Montana, where it amounted to more than 50 degrees. The weather is much colder in the lake region and Ohio valley, and in Utah. The weather is below normal except over small areas in Oregon, California, Montana, Alberta and Saskatchewan. Under the influence of the low pressure area noted off the north Pacific coast, it is expected that the temperature will rise, and that the anow will turn to rais by tonight. Strong southerly gales may be expected along the coast. Small araft warnings were ordered for the Washington coast at 7:30 a. m.
