DRUHOT IS CALLED BY GREAT UMP

Portland Southpaw Who Was With National League Succumbs to Injury.

Carl A. (Colly) Druhota, one of the few local baseball players who have donned major league spangles, succumbed Tuesday night in the Good Samaritan hospital as a result of an injury received at the Northwest Steel company's shipyard several weeks ago.

Druhota was born and raised in Portland, getting his start in baseball in "Goose Hollow." He was 35 years old. In 1914 he began his professional career with the Portland Pacific Coast league team.

He hurt his arm in the majors and drifted back to the Coast, playing with the Oakland outlaws one season. In 1911, he pitched for the Butte team of the Union association, winning 15 and losing 12 games.
