Harry Lauder Is Here for Last Time

Famous Scotch Entertainer to
Appear at Heilig Tonight for
War Benefit.

HARRY LAUDER, the great Scotch humorist-entertainer, will appear at the Heilig tonight for the last time. The positively final and last farewell which Patti worked until it was a threadbare, has never been used by the blunt old Scot, who in unvarnished language has said he has no use for such things. In fact Lauder has, until this trip, always assured his audience that he would be back again in a little while. So it may be taken for granted that this will be the last time Portland will see Lauder in the flesh. Lauder is rich, even as measured by the 1918 standard of wealth. He has an estate in Scotland and no incentive to acquire more. The killing in France of Captain Jack Lauder, his son, has taken away even the humorist's desire to gratify the demands of his admirers to come back again and entertain them. After Captain Lauder's death Harry Lauder decided to abandon the stage for good. He did not see how ever again with this idol shattered he could laugh and joke and sing for other amusement. Taking his own explanation for his change of spirit, he accepted an invitation to sing at a benefit in London. He was received with applause, laughter and audible weeping. Lauder found he could laugh and joke as of yore, and then he went to the trenches where he entertained thousands of British soldiers. His trip to America to raise a million dollar war fund for the British Red Cross followed.

Battle Pictures Wonderful

The picture was given a private showing Tuesday and everyone who was present was enthusiastic in its praise.

The cartoon picture shows the buildings in course of construction, the workmen laboring at top speed. As an instance, three huge buildings accommodating 900 men are depicted arising in the unbelievable time of 37 minutes.
