Hull Found Washed Ashore on New Zealand Coast.

San Francisco, March 20.—(I. N. S.)—The burned hull of a ship that was found washed ashore at Auckland and Napier, N. Z., February 20, today was identified as that of the three masted schooner Bertha Doeber in a cablegram received by the marine department of the Chamber of Commerce.

The vessel was identified by a ship's boat found near the wreck. The Bertha Doeber, 240 tons, left San Francisco November 3 for Littleton, N. Z., with a cargo of case oil, but was long overdue when the wreck was discovered.
