

PUBLIC MUST PAY STILL HIGHER PRICES FOR ITS FOODS

ROYAL ANNE SEASONS NOW AT ITS HEIGHT. DRINGS TO START SOON. Poultry Men's Meet Will Try to Save Industry of Section Meeting to Be Held in Portland Thursday to Discuss Measure of Securing Relief.

The cherry season is now at its height for Royal Anne in the local territory and prices are generally higher than last year.

The Royal Anne variety is now in considerable quantity that a rain or two would crack considerable stock, therefore it is absolutely necessary that growers get their needs within the next few days.

Highs are arriving in small lots from Eastern Oregon by the main freight line and variety will come within a week or 10 days.

Carl Woodcock, the well known shipper of the date industry, is conducting a campaign of the Journal that up to the present time there have been few things received there as they are a little later than the Royal Anne but the fruit is of excellent quality. The crop in the Dalles section is reported by Mr. Woodcock as being rather heavy although some of the orchards threaten a light output.

Canners are taking care of all the Royal Anne variety and are expected to have a surplus of this variety. This enables the trade to clean up although there is an overabundance of black stock.

STRAWBERRIES FAIRLY STEADY. Strawberries were held fairly steady in price for the day. On the farmers' market sales of good strawberries were reported at 17c, while along Front street sales were from 23.25 to 33.50 per crate. Receipts smaller.

SUGAR PRICES UP NICKEL HERE. Advance of 6c per hundred pounds was announced in the price of sugar by local jobbers. This advance is a reflection of the situation in the world market.
