

REHEARING WILL BE ALLOWED IN CHEWCAUCAN CASE

Portland Irrigation Company to Have Another Chance to Show That All Given Appeal Notice.

CATTLE COMPANY OPPONENT

Action of Supreme Court Today Reopens Motion to Dismiss Appeal; Other Cases Decided.

Salem, Or., June 25.—Attorneys for the Portland Irrigation company will have another opportunity to convince the supreme court that all the parties in interest were served with a notice of appeal in the Chewaucan river adjudication case, as the supreme court today granted a rehearing on the motion to dismiss the appeal.

It is in connection with this case that C. E. Wood, leading counsel for the Portland Irrigation company, has been fighting to obtain enough water from Chewaucan river to permit the company to complete the Paisley irrigation project in Lake county.

The state water board adjudicated the water rights and found that the irrigation company was entitled to enough water for the project, but the Chewaucan Land & Cattle company, which has immense land holdings in that part of the state, appealed to the circuit court and Judge Bernard Daly reversed the water board.

The Portland Irrigation company then appealed to the supreme court, which allowed the motion made by the cattle company to dismiss the appeal and ordered the appeal dismissed. The motion to dismiss was based on the allegation that all interested parties were not served by the irrigation company with the notice of appeal.

The action of the supreme court today grants a rehearing on this motion to dismiss the appeal. The rehearing will be by oral argument.

The court also granted a rehearing in the case of Malloy vs. Marshall Wells Hardware company, a personal injury case, and in the case of Rowe vs. Freeman.

Rehearing was denied in the case of Frederick vs. Sherman, Davidson vs. Madden and Wagoner et al. vs. City of La Grande.

Phoenix Tile & Lumber company, Portland; capital stock, \$15,000; incorporators, J. A. Backstrand, Conrad P. Olson and James R. Bain.

Absolute Confidence Expressed

These were the initial members of the Portland Limit club to be enrolled by District Manager Reed at the Liberty Temple this morning. Membership in the limit club requires the purchase of a \$1000 War Savings certificate. No individual is allowed to own more than \$1000, maturity value, in War Savings certificates. The government is determined to maintain the democratic character of the War Savings issue and will not permit any person or group to monopolize the investment that pays 4 per cent interest compounded quarterly, but yet, if necessary, may be withdrawn by giving the postoffice only 10 days' notice.

"From the way the campaign is starting throughout Portland, the responses which are given workers by the people and the intense patriotism that prevails in the hearts of Portland people, I feel absolutely confident of sweeping success," said City Manager McCall while District Manager Reed, consulting early returns from both the city and Multnomah county outside of Portland, made a prediction equally optimistic.
