

WORKERS AT SALEM GATHER ENERGY TO PUT W.S.S. OVER TOP

Twenty-nine Members Annexed to
Five Hundred Club in City;
Reports Show Optimism.

Salem, Or., June 25.—An enthusiastic bunch of workers met at noon Monday at the First Methodist church, where lunch was served, to turn in their reports, ask questions and gather more energy for putting the War Savings Stamp drive over the top in the Salem district.

The reports were all optimistic, and when Frank Devey made a talk, telling what it means to put Oregon in the front rank of states in the sale of baby bonds, the workers gave expression to their patriotic enthusiasm through vigorous applause.

Walter Toosa added to the patriotic enthusiasm by describing his visit to Camp Lewis. He declared the camp is being run on a plane of highest efficiency, and to see it, he said, gives encouragement to every citizen who is backing his government with the lives of his young men and his dollars.

He also emphasized the fact that even if less stress could be placed upon the patriotic duty of every citizen to buy all the stamps he can cash the stamps for face value and interest.

Cascade-Hood River Road in Bad Shape

Deputy Sheriff Long of Cascade Locks,
Warns of Soft Condition of Highway;
Predicts Fine Road After 15th.

"Automobile tourists should be informed that it is useless just now to attempt to make the journey by motor from Cascade Locks to Hood River over the Columbia River Highway," said Deputy Sheriff Stroud W. Long of Cascade Locks, who was in Portland Monday. "Many people try it, get stuck in the soft earth of the incompleteness of the road and have all sorts of trouble. The highway will not be closed for good, but when the workmen get through a new vista of scenic beauty will be opened to the public that will be well worth the delay."

"In my opinion the new part of the highway link will be the most beautiful of all, because of the greenness, the areas of open space and the sharp rocky points that afford an ideal variety from the more massive scenery of the Portland end of the highway."

"Motorists may ship their cars by the steamer Takoma from the locks to Hood River. Some attempt to save money by ferrying across and traveling to Stevenson, but they have to take steamer there anyhow, so they don't save much."

Newberg, June 25.—I. C. Morris, 65 years old, dropped dead Monday morning while on duty as fireman at the Jones Bros. Juice plant from heart failure. He leaves a widow and 11 children, six girls and five boys. His is the first death in the family of six children. He was born in Eldorado county, California, December 13, 1853. He had resided in this city seven years and had worked for the Jones company several years.
