Griff E. Jones, who enlisted in the navy early last year, has been in training at the Naval Aviation Station in France. He was assigned to the duty of a pilot on the battleship Missouri, and was on the ship in the great blizzard when it was hit by a fleet of 17 vessels last January. Fifteen men lost their lives by freezing, drowning or accidents.

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ESTACADA SCHOOL BOARD DECIDES ON COMMERCIAL COURSE

Additional Training Put Into the Curriculum; Special School Election to Be Held July 15.

Estacada, Or., June 28.—At a recent meeting of the school board of Estacada, it was decided to increase the opportunities for vocational training by the addition of a commercial course to the high school curriculum. It is anticipated that at least 40 students will demand this course and the board is now looking for a teacher to take charge of the work.

Ellwyn Rutherford, who has had charge of science and athletics for the past year, enters the army and reports for duty June 30. Mr. Rutherford was very popular in his line of work. The board would like to find a man to take his place.

With the above exceptions, the faculty of the Estacada school is now complete: Miss Jessie Hannah and Miss Gladys Carpenter, primary; Miss Lelia Howe, junior intermediate; Miss Ursula John-

son and John Ely, senior intermediate. Mr. Ely will be principal of the grade. To the high school Gertrude S. Dillon, Minnie Schreier and H. C. McCormick will return, and new teachers so far elected are V. A. Davis and Superintendent M. B. Signa.

Notices are out for a special school meeting, July 15, when a new board will be elected. This is necessary owing to the removal of Fred Jorg from the district and the resignation of Mr. Holder. J. W. Reed, chairman, completes his term of office at this time. He is being strongly urged to stand for reelection.

Plans are on foot for the organization of the upper grammar grades on a departmental basis with supervised study in all the more difficult subjects and emphasis on methods of work. The old high school rooms, which were abandoned when the new high school was completed last year, will be admirably adapted to the new plans, and the grade rooms vacated will be used for vocational work and physical training.
