Sixteen Jitneys Run—Sixteen jitney buses of the United Motor Bus company are now operating on city runs. The cars have taken out licenses as for hire machines and pay the regular license fee provided by ordinance. E. W. Roseman, one of the moving forces in the formation of the company, declares that the jitneys will not attempt to run on designated schedules for, if they did, they would be compelled to obtain a franchise from the city council. After spending several strenuous weeks in organizing the Oregon Women's Farm Reserve and finding not only several hundred women for fruit picking and other light farm work, but also including a large number of women men to provide automobile transportation for the workers to and from the orchards and fields, Mrs. Letta K. Gilmore, director of the reserve, has passed on her duties, temporarily, at least, to Mrs. Letta K. Gilmore, who has been acting assistant director.

Mrs. Gilmore will work under the general supervision of J. W. Brewster, chief farm help specialist for Oregon, with headquarters at 704 Oregon building. A number of the cherry and berry growers in counties near Portland are contributing to the work of the reserve.

Mrs. Gilmore has shared with Mrs. Wellen a substantial part of the credit for the large results already obtained.

GOVERNMENT TO TAKE OVER LARGE PART OF OREGON PRUNE CROP
Announcement for Packers to Save 50-60 Sizes Pleases Growers.

A large part of the Oregon prune crop will be taken over by the government, according to an announcement made by W. K. Newell, assistant federal food administrator, who says that all prune packers have been directed by the United States food administration to hold all prunes of the 50-60 size for government use.

The 1918 crop promises to be the largest ever produced in the state and the government buying will assist greatly in its marketing. The dry weather will reduce the size of the fruit considerably, so that the government's intention to take the medium sizes will be doubly welcome. The prunes will probably be used for the army and navy commissary.

It was agreed at the recent meeting of prune growers and packers held in conjunction with the food administration that the packers should pay 95 cents a pound for prunes of the 50-55 size and 94 cents for those of 55-60. Salmon canners have also been called upon by the food administration to set aside for government use 5 per cent of their stock this season. The government will then have the use of 65 per cent of the red, medium red and pink salmon and 20 per cent of the sockeyes for the use of the army and navy.

Centralia's School Building Not Ready
Centralia, Wash., July 17.—Monday was the date stipulated in the contract for the completion of the new \$45,000 Centralia school. The school board, however, will not impose a penalty on the contractor for delay, owing to difficulty at times in securing labor and materials.

The exterior of the new structure has been completed and finishing touches are being put to the interior.
