

# KELLAHER SEEKS MORE CAR SERVICE FOR SHIPWORKERS

Request Made That Use of Lines of O-W, R. & N. and Southern Pacific in City Be Granted.

## APPEALS TO GOVERNMENT

Emergency Fleet Corporation Asked to Help Improve Street Car Situation for Portland.

Streetcar transportation relief for Portland's shipyard workers is sought in a resolution prepared by City Commissioner Dan Kellaheh, which asks that the Portland Railway, Light & Power company be allowed by the government authorities to operate standard gauge cars on the Southern Pacific fourth street line and on the O-W, R. & N. company line from the Peninsula district to Hawthorne avenue on the east side.

Negotiations between the Emergency Fleet corporation and the streetcar company, whereby the government is to supply the company with 25 additional streetcars, have already been started. Kellaheh asks that these cars be placed in service on the cross-town lines of the Southern Pacific and the O-W, R. & N. company.

Present Service Inadequate The resolution, which will be considered at the council meeting next Wednesday, follows:

"Whereas the service afforded by the street railway lines of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company to shipbuilding and allied industries in the city of Portland, particularly the South Portland and Peninsula districts, is insufficient, improper and inadequate, and whereas there are existing facilities of other railroads which, if employed in conjunction with the carlines of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company, would constitute ample, adequate, convenient and proper transportation for employees of the aforesaid industries between their homes and their work, and whereas current reports indicate that the aforesaid Portland Railway, Light & Power company has been promised 25 new cars by the Emergency Fleet corporation of the United States government for use on the present inadequate and improperly located lines of the street railway company.

"Now, therefore, be it resolved by the city council of the city of Portland, Or., that the government authorities be advised that the present lines and equipment of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company do not adequately and properly and adequately serve the shipbuilding and allied industries of this city and that the use of the tracks of the Southern Pacific company in South Portland and of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company to and from the Peninsula district are necessary in order to provide proper and adequate transportation facilities, without the expenditure of a large amount of money, and

Request for Track Use Made "Be it further resolved that the government authorities be requested to allow the aforesaid Portland Railway, Light & Power company to use and employ the aforesaid tracks of the Southern Pacific company and Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company in providing supplementary service for employees of local shipbuilding and allied industries at a rate of compensation within the means of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company to pay under the circumstances, and

"Be it further resolved that the government authorities be requested that the 25 cars promised the Portland Railway, Light & Power company be of such design and equipment that they may be operated over the aforesaid lines of the Southern Pacific company and Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company, and

"Be it further resolved that a certified copy of these resolutions be transmitted by the auditor to Charles Plez, vice president, Emergency Fleet corporation, at Philadelphia, and to R. H. Lighton, director, United States railroad administration, Chicago, Ill., by mail, and the substance thereof telegraphed to the aforesaid officers."

## Country Clubs Are Thankful for Wood

Fuel Administration Gives Notice That No Other Fuel for Non-Essentials Will Be Allowed. Portlanders who are members of various country clubs surrounding the city will have reason this winter to give thanks for the fact that wood is the principal fuel used in the clubhouses. Otherwise they would be in the same boat with their eastern country club brethren who have just been notified by the national fuel administration that use of coal, coke and petroleum products will be restricted insofar as country club houses are concerned.

Under the regulations, however, no restrictions are placed on the use of wood when it is available without the use of railroad transportation.

Under the administration's new regulations wood must be used for fuel and it is probable that club officers will be notified by Holmes.

The restriction on clubs is part of the administration's program of cutting down on non-essentials.

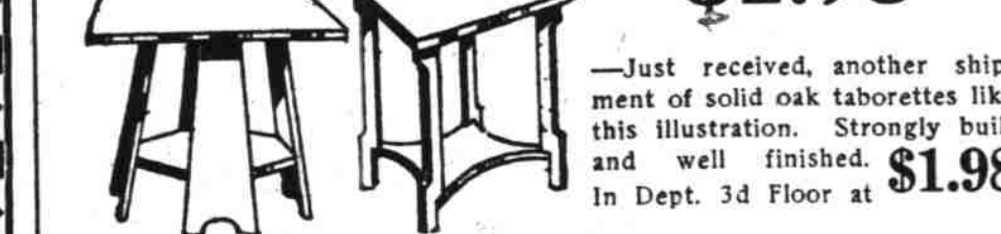

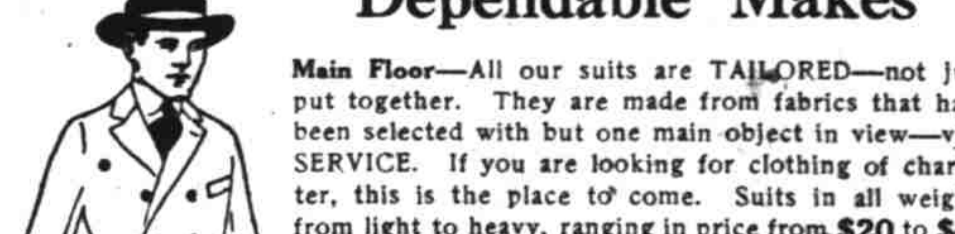

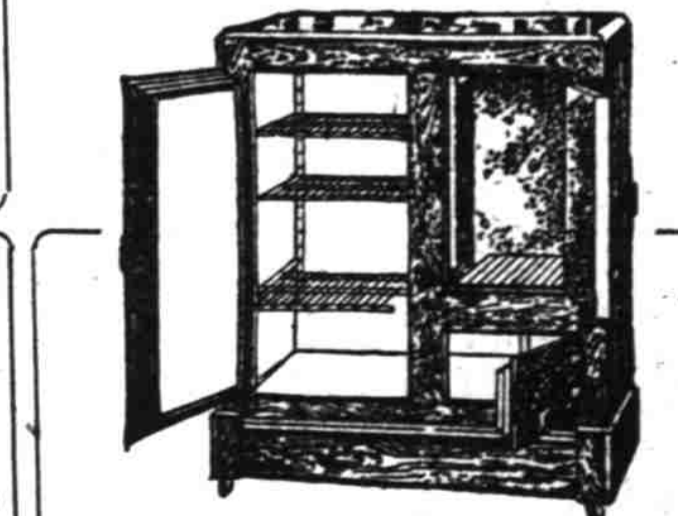
