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Bonanza District Being Irrigated

Water Reaches Many of the Ranches to Be of Help Before Harvest—Good Crops of Hay Will Be Gathered.

Klamath Falls, Or., July 20.—At Bonanza, 25 miles east of this city, the water which is to make the sandy fields into a great productive garden has already been turned on some of the ranches.

The heavy standing grain and hay fields of the Pine Grove section, seven miles east of Klamath Falls, which is being watered this season for the first time, are making good the faith placed by the owners who last year undertook the added expense of private irrigation.

The general direction of this affair is in the hands of an executive committee composed of one representative from each society. An adjourned meeting of this committee, now composed of 20, will meet Monday evening, July 22, at the Portland hotel for important business.
