

PREMIER'S WORDS PRAISED BY PRESS

London Morning Papers Agree
He Struck Keynote of Allied
Object in War.

London, Aug. 6.—(U. P.)—London morning newspapers are enthusiastic over Premier Lloyd George's message to the British people. They are unanimous that he struck the keynote of the allied object—that Prussia must be beaten until it is impossible for it to rise.

"The Kaiser told Ambassador Gerard that Great Britain is an obstinate nation," said the Mail. "She is in all that and something more. She is inspired in all her obstinacy with the idea that liberty must be secured and that justice must prevail."

"To stop short of victory is unthinkable," said the Times. "It would compromise mankind. No half way decision in President Wilson's words, would be tolerable or conceivable."

"The message is a direct appeal to every principle for which democracy stands," the Express said.

"The beast that sank the Lusitania must die," declared the Graphic.

"Premier Lloyd George says 'Hold fast' because any compromise inevitably would mean a prospect more awful still," said the Mirror.

"Lloyd George's spirit is improving, but he might also have said 'we must make good,'" said the Post.

"Lloyd George has given the watchword," the Telegraph said.

Three Dead Result of Shooting Affair

Canova, S. D., Aug. 6.—(I. N. S.)—Authorities are today investigating a mysterious shooting here, as the result of which three persons are dead. The tragedy occurred in the Royal hotel, Monday night, Mrs. F. Dexter, wife of a local banker, J. R. Williams of Anderson, Mo., or Cedar Bluffs, Neb., and a woman, who is believed to be Williams' wife, being the victims. No light has been thrown on the affair.

Mrs. Dexter, who prior to her marriage was known as Mrs. Williams, is believed to have been the former wife of the dead man. Williams is believed to have committed suicide after killing her, but whether the woman believed to have been his wife was killed intentionally or accidentally has not been established.

Special Course for Draft Men Arranged

Y. M. C. A., Cooperating With Other Organizations, Will Instruct Men in Certain Fundamentals for Soldiers.

A course of education for registrants through the state is being arranged by the service department of the Portland Y. M. C. A., in conjunction with the Knights of Columbus, the Jewish Welfare association, the Oregon Social Hygiene society and the State Council of Defense.

Captain J. E. Cullison of the adjutant general's office is sending a letter to all draft boards informing them of the contemplated plan and asking them to hold in abeyance any plans they may have had in mind until further notice, and stating that when the new organization, to be formed as related, is arranged, they will be notified formally.

It is in furtherance of the order issued July 1 by Provost Marshal General Crowder that boards of information be formed to lay before registrants certain fundamentals for their well being as soldiers. The plan adopted here by Barclay Acheson, secretary in charge of the local "Y" service department, is similar to that originated in Cleveland, Ohio, by Augustus Nash, general secretary, which worked so nicely that it was endorsed by the war department.

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FAILURE TO REPORT RECOVERY OF STOLEN CAR CAUSES TROUBLE

Soldier Is Taken in Custody
When Found on Highway in
Car Rented From Garage.

Repeated warnings issued by the sheriff's office to owners of stolen and recovered automobiles to report the recovery to the sheriff have at last borne fruit. A soldier boy was given a lot of trouble, however, because the warnings were unheeded.

F. E. Stevensen was arrested on the highway Sunday by Deputy Sheriff Wilson on suspicion that the car he was driving was stolen. Stevensen, who had his father and mother with him, protested loudly that he rented the car from Couchman & Sullivan. His explanations were received with extreme skepticism and he was brought into town, where it was found that Couchman & Sullivan had rented him the car, that it had been stolen previously and recovered, but not reported. Stevensen was released with apologies from all concerned.

FORMER BARKEEPER AMUCK

Chet Rollins, Believed Insane, Bothers
Linneman Residents.

Chet Rollins, an old time barkeeper in the wet days, ran amuck at 7 o'clock this morning on the Powell Valley road near Linneman station. Station Agent Cogswell telephoned to the sheriff's office. Deputy Sheriff Beckman was sent out to apprehend him, but found he had already been captured by Cogswell who was holding him. Rollins, it is reported, was running up and down nearby roads and going into people's houses. During the chase a young man named Dusenberry shot at Rollins, wounding him slightly in the shoulder. Rollins was lodged in the city jail. He will be extradited to his sanity.

They pleaded guilty today, George to a charge of carrying a dangerous weapon and Robert to larceny. They were sentenced to an indeterminate period in the penitentiary of one to two years and paroled.

Under the terms of the measure the mayor is authorized to name the commission, consisting of not less than 15 persons. The duties of the commission will be to urge matters of public safety on the streets, in factories, in the homes and elsewhere. The secretary-manager is to receive a salary of \$200 a month, the money to be paid out of the general fund.

Some opposition to the idea of a public safety commission as advocated has been expressed, it being contended that the police department is well able to perform the functions. The ordinance provides that none of the commissioners shall receive pay. The secretary-manager must be selected according to civil service rules, says LaRoche.

WILL CONSIDER PETITION

Firemen Renew Request That Two-Platoon System Be Installed

Petition of members of the Portland fire department for an ordinance granting the two platoon system will be considered at Wednesday's meeting of the city council. The request comes from practically all of the members of the fire bureau. The firemen declare that more deservations from the department will follow if the day and night shift system is not granted. Already the bureau has lost a number of trained firemen who have gone into the shipyards and other industrial plants. The two platoon measure was defeated by vote of the people last May.
