Portland Girls To Drive for Uncle Sam

Prominent Young Women Do Hard Work Preparing for Overseas Motor Service.

A NUMBER of Portland girls are hard at work preparing for foreign service in motor work. A call for recruits in this line for actual service abroad was answered enthusiastically by prominent young women, who have been acting in volunteer work for the American Red Cross in the motor squad corps. The applicants far outnumbered the demand but a few, who passed all the many regulations and requirements made by Uncle Sam, were finally selected, and these young women are now serving a strenuous apprenticeship.

Early in the mornings they sail forth perched high on motor trucks, not touring cars, and drive in and out of the most congested streets back up to various basement entrances and otherwise prove their skill as real drivers. Then comes the transfer of the engines, which they carry out under the guidance of skilled mechanics, flat on their backs beneath the cars. Punctures and various tire troubles and eccentricities are to be thoroughly mastered. As a last word of efficiency they are to be turned loose, it is stated, on the streets of New York city prior to sailing overseas, there to make their way under the difficulties of congested traffic.
